## NEW DAY PASSES TO MCGEHEE SHOPPERS WILL GO BY DISTRICTS

Effective Monday, Aug. 26, the following changes will be made in connection with day passes for shopping in McGehee and for other personal business in this vicinity, Project Director Ray D. Johnston reported yesterday.

Requests for such passes

will no longer be made in Ad. Building 1, but will be made through the block managers, and the following schedule for issuing passes (which has been recommended by the block managers as the most appropriate arrangement of blocks) will be effective:

Monday--District 1 (Blocks 38, 39, 40, 41, 32, 33, 34 and 28); Tuesday--District 2 (Blocks 25, 26, 24, 23, 9, 10, 8, 7); Wednesday--District 3 (Blocks 11, 12, 6, 5, 13, 4, 20, 27, 19); Friday--District 4 (Blocks 29, 17, 15, 16, 2, 1, 3, 14).

Four persons per block will be issued passes for that day. Children under 12 years of age must be accompanied by parents or guardian. Name, address and position (if working) of each person will be reported by the block managers to the chairman of the block managers the morning of the day preceding the day leave is to be effective. Passes will be prepared by the project director's office in the past and can be picked up at that office by the person securing leave.

Under these conditions the need for emergency passes will be very small, but in cases of real emergencies, such passes will continue to be issued at the project director's office. Applications for 24-hour leave to go to points outside of this county (such as to Pine Bluff or Memphis or Little Rock) will also still be filed at the project director's office. The number of these passes will continue to be limited to not more than five per day.

### RULE LIMITS MAILING OF FOOD OVERSEAS

The new rule announced in last Wednesday's OUTPOST tagging as "unmailable" candy and foodstuffs in 8 oz. packages applies only to overseas mailing, according to Post Office superintendent C.R. Bricker.

Mailing of Christmas parcels to servicemen overseas will begin on Sept. 15 and continue until Oct. 15.

## NISEI HEROES IN ITALY HONORED BY WAR DEPT.

WASHINGTON = Concealing a wound until his mission was accomplished, Sgt. Kay Ihara, a switch board operator with the Japanese American 442nd Combat Team, captured three Germans the first day he went into the front lines, a report to the War Department from the Fifth Army in Italy, and relayed to the Office of War Information, said.

Sgt. Ihara, whose home is at 1704 West 38th Ave., Denver, Colo., went out to assist a forward artillery observer, carrying a portable radio set. He was wounded slightly by shell fragments, but concealed his condition and refused to leave his post. As the attack moved forward, he observed a German before a cave in a mountainside. Armed only with a carbine, he captured two others.

Only when he returned from the field with his three prisoners did he submit to medical attention.

The War Department also announced that the Silver Star has been awarded posthumously to Infantry Cpl. Donald S. Hayashi, whose next of kin is his brother Harold T. Hayashi, Honolulu.

The Department citation, as reported to OWI, reads: "When his squad leader was wounded during a severe enemy counterattack in Italy in October, 1943, he took command of the squad on his own initiative. The squad, pinned down by the heavy enemy artillery, mortar and machine gun fire, had suffered heavy casualties and the order came to withdraw. (Continued on page 3)

(Continued from page 1) There being several men so severely wounded that immediate removal was impossible, he stayed behind, administering first aid and holding the position singlehandedly. For more than an hour and 40 minutes he fired his rifle at the enemy and held the advanced position until all the wounded were safely evacuated by litter squads. His courage and initiative in the face of grave danger helped save the lives of several of his comrades."

Opl. Hayashi was reported killed in action Feb. 9, 1944.

PHILADELPHIA - A few weeks ago I remarked that Philadelphia was not a very colorful city. Whereupon, a former Rohwer resident now living here claimed that I was all wet behind the ears. But nothing I have seen here so far has led me to change my opinion on the matter. For my money, Philadelphia has about as much color as the nickel cigar of the same name.

This is a large, dreary metropolis. It isn't the cleanest city in the world either, running Chicago, a close second on that score. On the credit side, it is one of the nation's top-producing arsenals, ranking with Detroit and Cleveland. Shipbuilding is quite an industry here. The other day they launched three battleships in half an hour at the local Navy yard, two cruisers and a flattop.

About 300 evacuees are now making Philadelphia their home. Relocation Officer Henry Patterson claims that the resettlement program is going retarded because of the ruling requiring provost marshall clearances (the so-called G2 permits) for defense jobs. That may be so, because those clearances are exasperatingly slow in coming thru. They are smothered in miles and miles of intangling red tape.

Secretary Ickes and Director Myer are said to be working on Secretary of War Stimson to ease the stringent restrictions a bit. Meanwhile, many an able and trained engineering ability is going to waste, waiting for the clearances. As for the firms themselves they would put them on the payroll right now if it weren't for the War Department.

Hiroshi Uyehara, a former Rohwerian who holds an engineering degree from the University of California, waited six months for his clearance so that he could accept a particular job.

## Dr. P. Webber Aids Students

Dr. P. A. Webber, representing Madison College of Madison, Tenn., is in the Center in the interest of student relocation. His headquarters is in Opal Albright's office, and any prospective students who are interested can reach him in Block 35.

Dr. Webber was formerly employed by WRA in relocation work, and he is accompanied by Mrs. Webber and 5 students from Madison College. He leaves Mon-

when it finally did come, the job had already been filled. Now he has to wait for another clearance for another job. And instead of going through some channels the first one did, it is in the hands of an entirely different reviewing group. As the Latins used to say, "O tempora, O mores!"

The Kaneda family, all eight of them, formerly of Rohwer, are living here. They are occupying the fourth floor of the local Fellowship House and getting along very nicely. Other ex-Rohwerians living in the city are Yuri Uyehara, Mary Matsuzawa, and a few whose names I don't know, while Masamori Kojima attends Haverford college, a short distance away. Living costs in Philadelphia are higher than in Chicago, cheaper than in Cleveland or Washington.

One thing about Philadelphia is that the streets are laid out fairly methodically. The one-way street

is an institution here. These narrow, alley-like one-way streets and the wider two-way street or another two-way street is called a square, from a two-way street to a one-way street a half square. Nobody refers to a block here. My first day here, I asked somebody how many blocks it was to the postoffice. "You're a newcomer here," he discerned.

All signs of the recent transport strike have disappeared, at least outwardly, the troops were withdrawn from the city recently, and the subway trains and surface cars are running smoothly and on schedule. After looking over the wide areas I have to traverse, I'm glad that I wasn't around during the strike. I like to walk, but not on those long Philadelphia squares. Besides, the cobblestone pavements that are common here make walking a bit difficult.
