MANGHAM TO PRE-SCHOOL CONFAB JOIN ARMY

F. R. Mangham, assistant project director in charge of administrative management, left this morning for his Louisiana home prior to his induction into the armed forces on Sept. 7 at a Texas camp.

Mangham, who has been on the personnel staff since the opening of the Center, was first assigned as administrative officer and later assumed his present position.

He was accompanied by his wife and two daughters who will take up residence in Louisiana.

LOYALTY OF JAPANESE AMERICANS CONFIRMED

Washington, July 29--- That portion of the nation's population which, because of foreign ancestry, became suspect when this country went to war, has given little trouble to its guardians.

F.B.I. Director J. Edgar Hoover says the "dollar patriots," misery chiselers" and "horseplay pranksters," whose American ancestry should leave no question of their loyalty, have proven much more of a problem than Japanese or other Axis nationals.

American citizens of Japanese ancestry, uprooted wholesale from their homes on the Pacific coast, have hardly a black mark. The War Relocation Authority reports no sabotage and no espionage among them, and probably a much smaller number of minor crimes and misdemeanors than would be found in another group of 125,000 persons.

There are approximately 10,000 Japanese Americans now in the army and probably several hundred have been killed. The 100th Infantry Battalion is composed entirely of Japanese, including many from Hawaii recruited before

The Japanese Americans now are combined in one organization, the 442nd Combat Team, and 5,000 of them recently saw action near Leghorn in Italy.

Bond purchases by the evacuees, says WRA, ranked about the same as those of other workers in the same wage class. The evacuees receive \$16 to \$19 a month for services in connection with camp operation. Some wealthy members of the colonies brought considerable blocks of bonds from their savings.

Vocation Leave For Part-Timers

PHILADELPHIA - Local nisei are doing pretty well in their program of integration and assimilation. There are two groups that are responsible for this. First, there is the Japanese American Social Committee, composed of nisei and some of the leading Caucasians. Its function is mainly social, and it holds one big gathering a month, where evacuees and Caucasians can meet and mingle and become acquainted. So far, it has sponsored two big picnics, with a third coming up.

Then there is the local steering committee, composed of nisei and Caucasians, which is the real guiding body. It meets once a month, plans the activities for the following month and coordinates the program as a whole. Under it are various subcommittees, such as hospitality, social, reception, housing, and others.

An interesting situation occurred here recently. Many of the evacuees felt that the local WRA office was slow in opening up employment fields, that what jobs were offered were menial, and that too many nisei were being placed in a few plants. So a nisei employment committee was set up, and the complaints were investigated, studied, discussed, and presented in the form of eight points to Relocation Officer Henry Patterson.

Patterson was big enough to admit that many of the complaints were justified. He promised to study the matter, see what improvements could be made, and report back to the committee. So far, the Committee has not heard from him. But if any results are obtained, you can chalk it up to initiative and hustle on the part of the local nisei and cooperation from the local WRA, which is as it should be.

Some of the nisei who are active in the local

The evacuees have many friends and supporters here. Two of them are Bob and Gerry Fort, who made a host of friends while directing the Friends hostel in Chicago. Bob is

relocation secretary for the American Friends Service Committee, while wife Gerry is secretary to the manager of the local Wanamaker store. I was up to their apartment the other night and saw some furniture that looked like a surrealist's dream.

They hastened to explain, however, that the furniture was not theirs, but came with the furnished apartment. Which all goes to show what some of us poor civilians have to put up with these days. Another friend is Tom Bodine, who is field secretary for the Student Relocation Council, which has done great work for nisei college students. Since evacuation, it has placed over 3500 nisei in 539 colleges and universities in 46 different states.

Encouragement and support have come from Elba Farabegoli, director of the local International Institute. She has invited the evacuees to participate in the activities here and has
