KOJIMA TAKES HONORS WHILE AT HAVERFORD

Ending a brilliant year and a half career on the Haverford College campus, 20 year old Masamori Kojima of 7-4-C graduated with high honors in Government at the close of the current semester.

Unhindered by the fact that he was working his way through Haverford, he received scholastic and elective honors as president of the Student Council, a member of the Debating Society, Tau Kappa Alpha, secretary of the International Relations Club, delegate to the IRC conference, and Corporation scholar. He also toured and spoke to clubs, societies and colleges on the problems of minority groups.

Haverford, a Pennsylvania institution, honors graduates whose work has been outstanding; two of the three mentioned were awarded to Kojima in Government and David Yi-Yung Hsia in Chemistry. Kojima will attend Harvard Law School.

Prior to evacuation, Kojima attended UCLA where he was an active member of various committees including Freshman and Sophomore Councils.

Re-entrance to Coast Possible

The WRA knows of no change of the War Department ban on evacuees returning to the West Coast. However, in certain cases return has been permitted.

Evacuees wishing to re-enter the evacuated area temporarily in connection with property should apply through WRA at a relocation center or relocation office. In order to re-enter for any other purpose apply to the Commanding General, Western Defense Command, Presidio, San Francisco.

MUNITIONS JOB OPENED FOR ALL

Issei and Nisei evacuees will help handle munitions at military depots, with their first employment to take place in the Army Ordnance Department at the Sioux Depot near Sydney, Neb., the War Department announced yesterday.

Those with unquestioned background and loyalty will be employed and the plan has the approval of the WRA, the office of the Provost Marshal General, and the Civil Service Commission.

Two Army officers visited the Center Wednesday and discussed the proposed employment with the Project Director, other members of the appointed personnel, and evacuee leaders.

A personnel officer from the munitions depot will come around Oct. 1 if enough interest is shown by residents. It is planned that an evacuee group inspect the plant and investigate the offer before his arrival.

Merchants, civic officials, church leaders, and labor unions are willing to accept evacuee workers and their families. Adequate housing facilities are available.

Additional information concerning employment at the Depot will appear in later issues of the OUTPOST or may be obtained at the Relocation Office in Block 42.

NISEI RECONNAISSANCE PATROL FIRST IN PISA

WITH THE FIFTH ARMY, ITALY--Members of a reconnaissance patrol of the Japanese American 442d Regimental Combat Team are believed to have been the first Allied troops to reach the historic city of Pisa.

At dusk on July 21, as elements of the 34th "Red Bull" Division pounded toward the city, a 12-man Nisei patrol, including Pvt. Sueso Takahashi whose parents live in Rohwer, officered by a naturalized Canadian and an American of French extraction, successfully entered Pisa to obtain vital information about the enemy defenses.

On the evening of July 20, the commanding officer of the Combat Team, which was spearheading the Fifth Army drive northward called for volunteers to go on a reconnaissance patrol and attempt to enter Pisa, then believed to be occupied by Germans in spite of rumors to the contrary. The regiment was at the time deployed along the

Colle-Salvetta-Nuova line.

Many times the number needed volunteered for the patrol. Finally, the 12 men selected were Sgt. Hiroshi Fujita, Pvt. Albert Nakama, Kaneohe, Oahu; Pfc. Jim Suzuki, Yasuo Fujino, Ken Higashi, all from Minidoka; John Nagamura, Lehaina, Maui; Frank Miyuchi, Maui; Pvts. Sueso Takahashi, Rohwer; Thomas S. Espinosa, Stockton, Cal.; Arthur Kiseki, Lawiston, Idaho; Heichi Oka, Punahoa, Maui; and Masaharu Okumura, Gila.

Pvt. Takahashi, whose parents Mr. and Mrs. Kameichi Takaki reside in 23-8-B, is a 1941 graduate of Long Beach Polytechnic High School. Outstanding in scholarship and sports, he is a life member of the California Scholarship Federation, and a four-year track letter man winning many state-wide awards. He volunteered for service in April 19, 1942, and was shipped overseas in May, 1944. His brother is awaiting call in Tex.

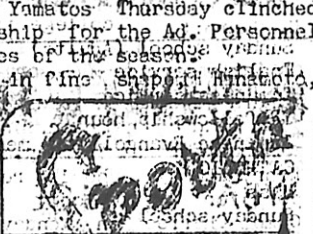
AD PERS' I WINS

Quite a responsibility and quite an achievement. Dyke Miyagawa, Seattle's nisei labor leader, is working for the local CIO war relief office... Sidney Hillman's Political Action Committee has a nisei girl, Mary Inoue, stenoging in its offices... Ran into Yasuo Tanaka of the Los Angeles photo supply, Tanakas in a subway station. Yas is living in Greenwich Village and attending New York U... Ex-Granadan Leo Tataru says that his brother Hughes, reported wounded in Italy with the 42nd, was not seriously hurt. The local Miyako restaurant seats its nisei customers in the backroom, while placing the Caucasian diners in the main dining room, which is much nicer and roomier. Whatever the reason, such practice of

segregation does not rest well with some of the nisei, who are patronizing the Japanese eatery quite regularly. A 63-year-old Issai was killed here last week when he either fell or jumped from the 8th story of an apartment house... There are three Protestant Japanese churches in the city and one Buddhist temple... Attended the morning service at the Japanese Christian Association last Sunday and heard Mas Toyotome, formerly of Los Angeles and Poston, preach to a jam-packed crowd of 125. Three or four of the apartment buildings in the upper Manhattan area, near Columbia U., are almost packed to the hilt with Japanese. In fact, if you have a friend living in New York, it's a ten-to-one chance that he or she is living somewhere between West 108th and 115th streets, just off Broadway. New Yorkham, I'd say.
