APPLICATION PROCEDURES FOR RETURN TO HAWAII, WEST COAST

In order to facilitate and channel handling of requests for return to Hawaii, the following procedure was established by the Community Council.

An evacuee desiring to return to Hawaii should write to the Provost Marshall General, War Department, Washington, D. C., applying for permission to return to Hawaii and giving the following information: Name and present address of applicants; date and place of birth; usual address in Hawaii prior to Dec. 7, 1941; name, relations, and address of members of immediate family both in Hawaii and on mainland; name and address of former employers and dates of employment; purpose of original visit to mainland; reason for return to Hawaii.

Since a person who was evacuated from Hawaii is not likely to be approved for return to Hawaii for the duration of hostilities, applications should be confined to persons who left Hawaii other than by evacuation.

The Community Council reiterated that the WRA knows of no change of the War Department ban on evacuees returning to the West Coast, however, in certain cases return has been permitted.

Evacuees wishing to re-enter the evacuated area temporarily in connection with property should apply through WRA at a relocation center or relocation office. In order to re-enter for any other purpose apply to the Commanding General, Western Defense Command, Presidio, San Francisco, Cal.

VOCATION TRAINING: ADULT CLASSES START IN OCT.

Benjamin D. Ramsdell of the High School faculty, and recently appointed supervisor of vocation training and retraining at Rohwer Center, promises a complete Vocational Training program for adults during the coming fall and winter months.

"Every possible effort will be made to establish training classes and situations for all adult members of the Rohwer community who desire to prepare themselves for new occupations, or to retrain in occupations which they have not followed in recent years. The ultimate purpose of the program is to aid evacuees in their relocation efforts," Ramsdell said.

Regardless of kind of occupation, all persons who are interested in the possibilities of this training and retraining program are requested to register at the office of Vocational Coordinator, W. H. Ritter, 35-7-C, between 2:30 and 5 p.m. on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Oct. 5, 6 and 7.

Where interest in any given trade or occupation, such as stenography, automotive repair, electric wiring, carpentry, is sufficiently large, actual evening classes will be formed. Where only one or a few persons request training in a given kind of work, an attempt will be made to establish individual day-time apprenticeships for them.

In summarizing this announcement, Ramsdell said, "I urge everyone in the Center who has a special vocation interest or problem to come in at registration time."
