# NISEI PROMOTED AGAIN T/SGT. MASUO CHOMORI OF GLENDALE ADVANCED TO 2nd LT. FOR LEADERSHIP

WITH THE FIFTH ARMY,  
ITALY---For demonstrating  
exceptional qualities of  
leadership against the  
enemy on the Fifth Army  
front in northern Italy,  
T/Sgt. Masuo Chomori, form-

erly of Glendale, Cal.,  
has been commissioned a  
second lieutenant.

A platoon sergeant with  
the Japanese American 442d  
Regimental Combat Team since  
its activation in Feb., 1943, Chomori won  
his battlefield commission  
for his exemplary and in-  
spiring leadership during  
both training and battle  
periods. He demonstrated  
his abilities as a field  
commander under the most  
adverse conditions in com-  
bat.

When his platoon leader  
was wounded during an at-  
tack in the vicinity of  
Suvereto, Italy, Chomori  
assumed command and re-  
organized his platoon and  
directed its withdrawal to  
a more tenable position.  
against heavier enemy coun-  
terattacks.

On another occasion,

near Molino A Ventoabato,  
he again assumed charge of  
his platoon when his platoon  
leader was wounded. Holding  
off enemy counter thrusts after capturing  
its objective, his platoon  
was entrenched in the center  
of the company sector on high ground dominating  
the fields of fire to the  
company front. When German  
artillery laid a heavy  
barrage on the Japanese  
American positions, followed  
by a concentrated 81-mm  
mortar barrage, Chomori  
displayed extraordinary  
coolness in controlling  
his men whose effective  
rifle fire drove back several  
German counterattacks.  
Though his group suffered  
ten casualties during this  
action, he personally supervised  
their evacuation to safer territory.

will be doubled to 10,000

# SIOUX DEPOT — by SAM SENO

Since all workers engaged in this vital wartime Ordnance Depot are under Civil Service regulations, such benefits provided by the Federal Compensation Act of September 7, 1916 are available to all. The application of this safety insurance measure is definitely a great asset to all employees.

If a Civil Service employee, while at work, is injured he will receive medical and surgical care and hospital service supplies. The hospital facilities at Sioux Depot are complete in every detail. This care is all included in the compensation.

There are many benefits while a worker is disabled

for duty. If one is partially disabled, the benefits are to be  $\frac{2}{3}$  of the loss of wage earning capacity caused by the said injury. This compensation will be credited to the injured starting on the fourth day after his wages stop. If the injured is totally disabled, he will receive  $\frac{2}{3}$  of his monthly pay but not more than \$116.66 or less than \$58.33 a month.

#### IN CASE OF DEATH

In case of death the total compensation cannot exceed  $\frac{2}{3}$  of the monthly payment of the deceased. The computation of compensation will be based on a monthly pay not to exceed \$175 and not less than \$87.50. The burial expenses will not exceed \$200 and transportation of the body, if desired, will be furnished if the deceased is a resident of the United States dying away from home. The widow or wholly dependent widower will receive 35% of monthly pay of deceased until death or remarriage. Each child under 18 years will receive 10% of monthly pay until death, marriage, or reaching age of 18; 25% of monthly pay of deceased will go to one child under 18, if there is no widow or dependent widower. Each additional child under 18, will receive 10% to be divided among the children equally. This compensation will be received by the guardian until death, marriage, or until the child reaches 18 years.

#### SAFETY INSURED

This article of information is not to warn you of any impending danger at this Depot but merely to point out the helpful benefits if a worker met with an accident. In two years of Ordnance Service there has been no fatalities. The few injuries came to only those who were careless—an enviable record. Munitions handling may seem to be perilous but observation showed that all merchandise handled by the regular worker was defused. All dangerous explosives are taken care of by technical experts.

## DR. YUASA TO CONDUCT LOCAL CHRISTIAN MISSION

Dr. Hachiro Yuasa of New York City is coming to Rohwer to take part in the Rohwer Christian Mission which will be held from Nov. 5 to 9. A series of Center-wide public meetings in various relocation Centers will be conducted by Dr. Yuasa, former president of Doshisha University.

Dr. Yuasa studied in the universities of Germany, France and Italy. In December 1938, he attended the Word Missionary meeting in Madras, India.

He is now associated with the New York Church committee for Japanese Americans and sponsored by the Council for Social Action of the Congregational-Christian Churches, headquarters in New York City.

The Rohwer Christian Mission was held here last year in May. Dr. Yuasa is making a tour of the various centers as a member of the Mission team.

## First Chicago Buddhist Church

October 8 marked the inaugural worship service of the Chicago Buddhist Church with a congregation of Nisei and a sprinkling of Americans of other ancestries in attendance.

The Rev. Gyoman M. Kubose, pastor, officiated. The new church is affiliated with the Buddhist house of Los Angeles and the Dharma House of Santa Fe. Participants included representatives of the eight relocation centers, Nisei servicemen, the Issei and longtime Japanese American Chicanos.

## LAUD NISEI AMERICANISM

Under the heading of "Our Japanese American Soldiers," the Oct. 8 Arkansas Gazette ran an editorial on the five Nisei soldiers whose deaths in action were commemorated in a recent memorial service in Rohwer.

"By giving their lives for the land where they were born, the five Japanese American soldiers who were honored in memorial services at the Rohwer Relocation Center proved in heroic way that Americanism is in the mind and heart, not in the blood."

These young men, who were killed in action while fighting with the Fifth Army in Italy, were members of the 442nd Infantry, a regiment composed of Americans of Japanese ancestry, which has made a battle record that measures up to the army's traditions of devoted and effective service."


