# RECREATIONAL INSTITUTE OPENS NATIONAL LEADERS TO PARTICIPATE

Led by representatives from five national organizations, the Recreational Institute will begin Tuesday evening in Mess hall 35, aiming to increase efficiency in the activities of various organizations and to enrich their programs. Assistance will be given by local leaders, Dr. Nat R. Griswold, supervisor of CA, said.

With Wilmer J. Kitchen, YMCA secretary, as coordinator, leaders from the outside participating in the conference will be the following:

Marshall Stalley, consultant for community activities of the Washington WRA, will be here for the entire 10 days. He formerly was with the National Recreation association and has worked as recreational leader for men in army camps. He has visited all of the centers and comes here directly from Tule Lake where he was helping to organize activities.

Miss Margaret Chesmore is on the national field staff of the Girl Scouts of America with headquarters in New York City. She is especially experienced in leadership of Scouts and Camp Fire Girls. Outdoor crafts and camping have been her special interests and responsibilities.

Miss Frances Lunn of the St. Louis YWCA worked with the older girls in that organization. She is a splendid resource person for boards and committees who want help on program materials and promotional devices.

## REPORT ON EX- U.S. RESIDENTS RECEIVED MON.

The following report was picked up by the Federal Communication Commission monitors, according to a teletype received Monday. The message was a Radio Tokyo Broadcast in English to Western United States.

"Former residents of the United States who returned to Japan aboard the steamship Toia Maru will (one word was missing) a village in Manchuko. The government authorities in Manchuko are making preparations to accord every courtesy to the new settlers."

Some one has been kind enough to send me the OUTPOST each week since I left the Center. I am very grateful to this benefactor for I want to keep up with the news of the Center. In fact, the OUTPOST is received on my desk here with more enthusiasm than it was received when it came to my office in the Relocation Building No. 2.

There are not many evacuees living in Indianapolis but in my search for a house in which to live, I have come to understand the problem which evacuees are up against as they go to big cities and try to find living quarters. Friends were kind enough to take Mrs. Hunter and me in for the time but we were here three weeks before we found any place that we could engage as a permanent home. Places to rent are very difficult to find and places to buy are priced far beyond their value. I am sure that this must be true in practically every big city. At any rate, we have a house into which we shall move about the 10th of November and after that we shall be glad to receive guests from the Center. Even before that date, I want to know when people from the Center are passing this way. I can always be reached by calling or writing to Missions Building, 225 Downey Avenue, Indianapolis.

# A. VETRANO JOINS WAVES

Since registering for this Depot is in favor of family unit relocation, there are numerous precautionary measures any family head must bear in mind. The most important of these is, no doubt, the well-being of his family in the way of health.

Hospital facilities are as complete as can be found anywhere. A post army surgeon with registered nurses and civilian medical specialists are on the staff. Private rooms and wards similar to the setup here at Rohwer Hospital are available with a complete operating room, delivery room, nursery and dentist.

The following hospital and dental charge listing is available to all residents at Ordville, the housing project at Sioux Ordnance Depot;

### HOSPITAL CHARGES:

- Dispensary visits..... 50 each
- House visits (limited to those living on the area and at Ordville. Cost of prescription, if any is extra)..... \$1.00 each
- Hospitalization for medical cases (Includes all services)..... \$4.25 day
- Hospitalization for surgical cases (Includes all charges)..... \$6.50 day
- Hospitalization for maternity cases (Includes all charges)..... \$6.50 day

If a private room is necessary for the proper treatment of a patient, or if the patient request a private room, it is available, an extra charge of \$2 per day for both medical and surgical care will be made. The use of private rooms will be left to the discretion of the Post Surgeon.

Laboratory services (For cases which are not hospitalized)..... \$ .50

### X-Ray Services:

- (1) For a 14 x 16 film..... \$2.00 each
- (2) For each film smaller than 14 x 17..... \$1.50 each

### DENTAL CHARGES:

- Emergency treatment, palliative..... \$ .50
- Dental Prophylaxis..... \$1.00
- Extractions:

- Simple, first..... \$1.00
- Simple, subsequent..... \$ .50
- Impacted Teeth..... \$5.00

### Anal am fillings:

- Cavities involving one-tooth surfaces..... \$1.00

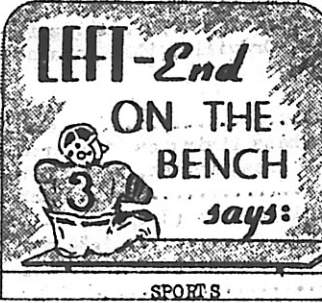
