## NISEI STUDENT RELOCATION REPORT

A total of 550 American institutions of higher learning in 45 states have enrolled nearly 3,000 Japanese American students in the past two and a half years, comprising almost all the young evacuees formerly in relocation and assembly centers who wanted college training reported the WRA.

The current enrollment is approximately 2,500, about evenly divided between men and women.

The Nisei college group on Dec. 7, 1941, totaled 2,300 registered in 74 colleges and universities in Calif., Ore. and Wash., and about 200 in colleges elsewhere in the country. Evacuation left only the 200 Nisei student in colleges east of the Sierra Nevadas.

Each year about 400 of the 200 graduates of the eight center high schools enter college. Since May 1, college applicants among these graduates have been

accepted by more than 150 different institutions.

Evacuation generally strained individual financial resources, with the result that a relatively high percentage of the evacuee students have worked for board and room after classes. WRA provides no funds to aid evacuee students, but various church groups, working with the Student Relocation Council, in the past two years have donated more than \$120,000 toward tuition scholarships.

WRA and the Council recently divided responsibilities involved in relocating students. The WRA has agreed to the following:

1. A member of the high school staff will be designated as student relocation counselor who will aid students in selecting an educational institution, in procedure to gain admission, etc.
2. WRA will inform the Council of acceptances, etc.

Lillian Ota, now holder of a graduate fellowship in history at Yale, competed for five scholarships last year at Wellesley College and won all five.

## INGALLS OF NATIONAL YMCA REPORTS COUNCIL RESOLUTION

Harold Ingalls of the National YMCA reported the following resolution unanimously voted on by the recent national council meeting in Buffalo:

That the Council register its continuing concern for the civil rights of the evacuees of Japanese ancestry and for their reincorporation into normal community life. While recognizing the authority to determine the time for return of evacuees to the West rests solely with the War Department in its capacity as guardian of national security, the Council recommends that in the near future area councils, local association boards and individual members, especially in the Western States, assure the Commander of the Western Defense Command that, if and when the War Department revokes or further relaxes the exclusion order, they will exert themselves to foster a community-wide spirit of cooperation with the action of the War Department and will extend assistance and fair play to returning evacuees and veterans of Japanese ancestry.


