Dr. Hachiro Yuasa, former president of Doshisha University of Kyoto, Japan, will arrive directly from Gila River to speak in Japanese to the adults at the Auditorium tomorrow night at 7:30.

GAZETTE EDITORIALIZES ON NISEI WAR VETERANS

The following editorial appeared in the Arkansas Gazette of Nov. 2;

Four American soldiers who served in the Italian campaign are shown in an Associated Press news picture. One lost a leg at Cassino. Another lost his right eye and an arm near Romo. Another lost an arm at Anzio.

These American soldiers are Capt. Kiyoshi Kuramoto, Sgt. Robert Y. Oda, and Privts. Kenneth Otagaki and Tamotsu Shimitsu. They are members of the 100th United States Infantry Battalion, which was the first group of Nisei (nee-say) or Americans of Japanese descent, to take part in active combat in this war.

The 100th Infantry Battalion has a fine record, which is discussed in "Nisei in Uniform." The nucleus of the organization was composed of men from two Hawaiian infantry regiments of the National Guard. A number of the guardsmen had taken part in the defense of the Honolulu area during the Japanese attack of December 7, 1941. Two members of the battalion captured the first Japanese prisoner taken by the United States in World War II. The battalion was sent to this country for training, and then transferred to Africa. It took part in the invasion of Italy at Salerno. Lt. Gen. Mark W. Clark conferred upon the War Department's distinguished unit citation for its performance at Sassetta and Belvedere.

U.S. Court Hears Cases Of Nisei

Hearings on the Korematsu and Endo cases before the United States Supreme Court on Oct. 11 and 12 brought into sharp focus some of the most important legal issues involved in the evacuation and relocation program, according to E. E. Ferguson, acting solicitor of WRA.

Attorneys for Fred Korematsu contended that Congress did not contemplate the use of Public Law 503 (which the appellant is charged with violating) as a means of enforcing a mass

WAR HERO: SGT. SUGIYAMA'S EXPLOITS CITED

An official release has reported the battlefield exploits of Sergeant Togo S. Sugiyama who recently succumbed to wounds.

Sugiyama, in a single day near Palestina, Italy, killed three German snipers and five machine gunners, took one prisoner and was credited with knocking out or routing four machine gun nests.

His outfit, the 442nd, was fighting with the 35th "Red Bull" Infantry Division on the Fifty Army front at the time.

Sergeant Sugiyama whose family reside in the Center was formerly of Los Angeles.

"freeze order" and the subsequent detention involved in the controlled evacuation were unreasonable methods of effecting the order even if military necessity existed; and (3) that Korematsu was justified in refusing to obey the exclusion orders to avoid detention.

This statement is in line with the earlier expression of the WRA Solicitor's office. The ruling also bears out the accepted opinion that center residents do not lose residence or voting rights in the states from which they were evacuated.

For the government, Charles Faly, solicitor general, argued that Public Law 503 was applicable; that the court should not go behind the decision as to military necessity; that voluntary evacuation was tried and failed and that once involuntary evacuation was undertaken other matters such as detention in assembly centers followed as necessary incidents to a reasonable carrying out of the program.

The same denial of voting rights in Wyoming applies to persons residing, because of the national emergency, on military posts and stations, which are federal, not state property.

It will be recalled that Korematsu remained within the exclusion zone follow-

ing the evacuation order. He was convicted for failure to obey the exclusion order applicable to him. His appeal directly raised the question of the constitutionality of the evacuation order.
