

7TH ARMY "LOST BATTALION" RESCUED BY NISEI IN 442D

A "lost battalion" of the Seventh Army, which was cut off by the Germans for a week in the St. Die area, was relieved by Japanese American troops, according to an Associated Press release from the Sixth Army group in France as reported by the Arkansas Gazette of Nov. 7.

The Japanese-Americans who fought their way to the trapped men late on the afternoon of Oct. 30 were of the 442d Regiment.

"It really was ironical that we were so glad to see the Japanese," said Pvt. Walter Yattaw, Providence, R. I., "but boy, they are real Americans."

A 48-man patrol of the battalion came back with only six men after its seven days of isolation.

NISEI PRAISED T/Sgt. Tanouye Exemplifies

DEDICATION FOR NEW PLAYGROUND

The dedication of the childrens' Playground will be held on the Center-wide Field Day program, Tuesday, Nov. 14. Equipment, such as swings, bars, slides, etc., were donated by Center children by Ed Finch of Hattiesburg, Miss., and the 442nd Infantry composed of Japanese-Americans now in France.

An invitation has been sent to Finch to be present at the dedication.

"He was a credit to his race, an excellent soldier, a loyal American who was respected and admired by everyone in the company," wrote T/Sgt. Ted Tanouye's commanding officer in a letter of condolence to his parents Mr. and Mrs. Nikuma Tanouye of the Center.

In the recent fight for Hill 140 on the Fifth Army front in Italy, when his men were pinned down by enemy fire, Tanouye skirted the enemy positions and scored a direct hand grenade hit on a machine gun nest. Later he again flanked the main enemy line and wiped out another machine-gun nest. His action, followed by a mortar barrage, opened the way for the remainder of the 34th division troops to drive the Germans from their hill-top position.

Tanouye, a graduate of Torrance high school, entered the armed forces in 1942 training at Fort Monmouth and Camp Shelby.

A bunch of us fellows were sipping coffee and sitting around talking about things in general. It was a good, old-fashioned bull session, such as we enjoy now and then.

We talked about the war, relocation, post-war possibilities for Nisei, Roosevelt and Dewey, and about a few other topics of the day.

Then the bull session drifted--as bull sessions will--to topics of lesser importance, such as women.

One of the younger men raised the question: "What do you think of the young ladies in Rohwer?"

Nobody volunteered an immediate answer. I, of course, kept my trap tightly shut, because the subject of women is one of many on which I am not well informed.

Then up spoke the only married man in the group, and what he said might be of some interest to you girls. You may not agree, but you may profit from it.

He said that there were four things wrong with the Rohwer girls. And he qualified it by saying that he was speaking with constructive intent. (That's the difference between men and women. We men generally criticize constructively.)

The first thing wrong with the local lasses, he said, was that they didn't interest themselves in the affairs of the country or the world. He opined that they should know a little bit about what was going on every day. Not that they should be experts, but just enough to converse a little.

The second thing wrong, he said, was that the girls didn't know how to accept compliments gracefully. Generally, when one professes a sincere compliment to a young lady, the stock answer is: "I'm sorry, but I don't have any money
