U.S. Sending Mail To Japan By Air

The United States Government is now carrying all prisoner of war and civilian internee mail for the Far East by air free of charge from the United States to Teheran, Iran, from Teheran the mail is transported across the Soviet Union by the Russians to Japanese authorities.

The State Department has invited the Japanese government to do the same with the Soviet delivering the mail to Teheran. From Iran the U.S. will take it free of charge to the addressees.

AMENDMENT

The Center residents will vote today on the following proposed amendment to the Constitution: Any evacuee resident of Rohwer Relocation Center who has been recognized by a two-thirds majority of the Councilman shall become chairman of the Community Council. This amendment had not been passed as announced in the Wednesday OUTPOST.

Formerly the Council chairman has been elected from among the Councilmen.

Former Linden, Cal., native Pfc. Minoru M. Yoshida died at the French front on Oct. 31. He is survived by his father, Toshio Yoshida of 34-11-A.

Succumbing to wounds on Oct. 29, Pfc. Masaru Tashima died in action on French soil. Notification was received by his brother, Frank Masahi Tashima of 14-8-C, former Fresman.

Pvt. George Takahashi was reported missing in action on Oct. 29. Mr. and Mrs. Konji Takahashi, his parents who are from Artesia, reside in 9-1-C.

Pfc. Tadayoshi Hashimoto was seriously wounded on Oct. 31, according to the telegram received by his parents Mr. and Mrs. Chutarō Hashimoto of 3-6-A. The Hashimotos are from Los Angeles.

Mrs. Chizuko Hirahara of 39-2-B was notified that her husband Sgt. Dave Hirahara was seriously wounded on Oct. 31. Seattle, Wash., was their former home town.

Pvt. No boru Tanihara sustained wounds on Oct. 20, Mrs. Yaeko Nobusuye of 25-4-D was informed. They lived in Santa Maria, formerly.

Pfc. Tadashi Arimura, slightly wounded on Oct. 30, has parents, Mr. and Mrs. Yotaro Arimura, in 19-6-C. Before the war they lived in Lenoore, Cal.

Also slightly wounded was Pfc. Speed M. Harada, whose parents Mr. and Mrs. Kiiohi Harada, former Norwalk residents, now reside in 17-11-A.

On Oct. 29 in France Pfc. Sakai Sugimoto received slight wounds, according to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Yuitsa Sugimoto of 12-5-B. Los Angeles was their home prior to the war.

From Palo Verdes, S/Sgt. Minoru Sumida was slightly wounded on Nov. 3. Jinjiro Sumida, his father, lives in 12-1-C.

EVACUEE PROPERTY SERVICES ENUMERATED

In a series of five articles, the Evacuee Property Office of WRA will inform the evacuees with its services and limitations and aid them in solving their problems.

The first article entitled "General Information" follows:

The Evacuee Property Officer offers many and varied service to the evacuee and acts as intermediary or "middleman" in all property problems.

While its functions necessarily are limited, there are many ways in which the Property Office can be of service.

RELEASE CA FINANCIAL STATEMENT THRU OCT.

CA released its financial statement for September and October as follows:

September total income, \$645.65; total expenses, \$29.68; balance, \$615.97.

October total income, \$809.52; total expenses, \$132.54; balance, \$676.98.

For example, it can arrange for the sale of any property, either real or personal, which the evacuee may wish to sell. It can arrange for the leasing or renting of business, residential or farm properties, assist in collection of obligations in the form of bills, mortgages, or other type of debts where such collections can be made without having to take legal action.

The Property Office can attempt the settlement of disputes arising from contracts or agreements between evacuees and residents of the evacuated area; it can investigate and report on the conditions of properties, personal effects, etc., and can, where court action is not involved, dispose of problems connected with the business of property interests of evacuee.

However, no such action will be taken without the approval and consent of the evacuee and the evacuee should remember to make all requests for aid on property problems on WRA Form 153 or 153A.

In addition to the above, the Property Office can arrange for the picking up and storage of personal or commercial property of the evacuee.

As has been stated before, functions of the office are limited. For example, the Property Office cannot assume responsibility for accepting or rejecting bids for property. No sale will be made to the evacuee and his acceptance of the offer has been received in writing by the Property Office. The evacuee, of course, is required personally to sign any legal documents required to complete the transaction.

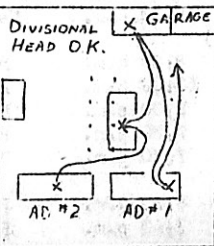
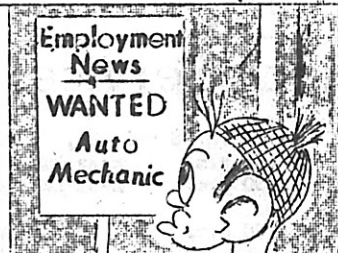
