LIST 262 FROM VARIOUS CTRS. AS CASUALTIES

Heavy fighting on the Western front in Europe has accounted for 88 recent Japanese American casualties, including 20 killed in action and 68 wounded reported within the last 10 days to parents or next of kin living at relocation centers, the WRA said.

Casualties in France, added to those in Italy and the South Pacific, bring the total to 69 Nisei killed, 187 wounded and 6 missing, WRA reported in a compilation based on individual War Department notices received at the centers.

The actual total of battle losses among Japanese Americans from the mainland is larger than the agency's compilation of 262 casualty notices. More than one-third of the evacuees have relocated from the centers to outside communities, and several thousand persons of Japanese ancestry, who lived outside the West Coast restricted area prior to evacuation have never been in a center. WRA has no means of recording casualties among these families.

Of the 13,000 Nisei who have been inducted into the Army, 2,146 entered as volunteers of selectees from relocation centers latest WRA statistics show. The others were Japanese Americans from Hawaii and from Nisei in the United States who had left the States or were never subject to the evacuation.

Applications for original or duplicate account number cards, and requests for changes in record because of marriage, error in date of birth or other reason, can be obtained from the local post office.

EVACUEE PROPERTY

Evacuees who wish to collect debts owed them may do so with the aid of the Property Office if they will supply complete information to that office.

The date of the note or the date the debt was made; explanation of how and for what the debt was made (for work done, goods purchased, etc.); the original amount of the debt, rate of interest and the plan of repayment agreed upon; the balance due, name and address of the debtor; and any evidence of the debt, such as a note, mortgage, purchase contract, etc., should be given.

Where an evacuee wishes to rent or lease property he should supply the Property Office with an accurate description and the location of the property. He should specify rental rates keeping in mind that OPA rent ceilings may apply and that where they exist rental rates cannot be raised without OPA's authorization. Such permission is usually hard to get. Complete details about the terms of leases, length of lease desired and other special terms should be given. In cases where farm land is to be rented out or leased, it is important that the evacuee supply the Property Office with complete details about irrigation assessments, electricity bills, water district taxes, methods of determining shares when share rent is desired, use of farm equipment left on the farm, building insurance and his desires regarding all other leasing specifications.

Dates for payment of rent and expiration of leases should be specified to the Property Office. It can also help the evacuee in handling matters such as inspection of property, fire insurance, vandalism and pilferage.

As long as the military exclusion order remains in effect WRA will provide storage space for property left in the evacuated area or in a Center by a relocatee or serviceman.

But WRA is not responsible for the storage or care of a relocated evacuee's property at the point of relocation. This includes property of evacuees who were inducted after relocation. WRA will, however, assist in moving the house—(Continued on page 3).

WRA Releases Statistics For Resettled Evac.

Wider and more even distribution of Japanese American evacuees in relation to total population throughout the U.S. has developed with relocated families and individuals now reported in 47 out of the 48 states and the Dist. of Columbia.

Eleven states have more than 500 relocatees each. Illinois, with 8,085 evacuees resettled among its 7,897,000 residents, is first. Chicago has 6,593.

The number of relocatees in each of the next 10 states, and the locality with the greatest number in each, follow:

Colorado, 3,352 (Denver, 1,516); Ohio, 2,599 (Cleveland, 1,641); Utah, 2,146 (Salt Lake City, 878); Michigan, 2,121 (Detroit, 940); Idaho, 1,639 (Cald-well, 200); Minnesota, 1,396 (Minneapolis, 876); New York, 1,289 (New York City, 1,051); Washington, 914 (Spokane, 602); Missouri, 650 (St. Louis, 231); New Jersey, 555 (Bridgeton, 443).

hold, personal and commercial property of evacuees going out on indefinite leave.

An evacuee inducted into the armed services wanting WRA to store property left in a center or on the West Coast should designate some person to represent him in dealing with WPA.

Any evacuee wishing to have personal or commercial property picked up and stored must fill out Form WRA-155. The form must be filled out, witnessed and signed by the owner or for him by someone who holds power of attorney.

Evacuees who wish property stored by them in a commercial warehouse or in private storage transferred to a WRA warehouse must pay storage costs that have accrued before WRA can move such property.

The evacuee must supply warehousing receipts.

WRA warehouses at Seattle, Portland, Sacramento, Stockton, Fresno, Watsonville, Los Angeles and San Francisco store evacuee property.

CLOWNS POLKA DOTS TIE GAME INTO 6-6 KNOT

The underdog Polka Dots coached by Junji Sasaki tied the Clowns in a thrilling game Sunday afternoon.

The Polka Dot's score came in the early part of the first quarter when Yo Fuji caught Kikawa's blocked pass, and ran the ball 50 yards to the end zone untouched behind Shim Yagi's beautiful blocking. Kubo's attempted conversion went wide of the uprights and the score stood 6-0.

The resettlers, family groups and individuals are reported living in 207 cities and towns scattered over the country. In addition, isolated cases in the 29,740 total have reported from rural and semi-rural areas too numerous to be included in the compilation.



