## McGowanHead ROHWER CASUALTIES Procure't Off. Center's Casualty List Mounts

Charles McGowan, former assistant procurement officer, will be acting procurement officer, replacing J. C. Moody who left Nov. 25 to enter private business.

Filling his past position in the Center since Jamuary 1943, McGowan had been previously with the N. O. Nelson Company in Jackson, Miss., for seven years as assistant purchasing agent.

Added to the lengthening are list of Rohwer casualties, which total 45 according 26 w to telegrams received by of next of kin still resident serie in the Center, were three were servicemen reported killed ed. and four wounded in action not

on the battlefields of France.

Of the 45 announced casualties, sixteen have been reported killed in action. Three soldiers

are described as "missing in action". Of the 26 who comprise the list of wounded, sixteen were seriously hart and ten were only slightly wounded. This accounting does not include the notifications to former residents of Rohwer who have relocated.

A tersely worded War Department telegram informed Hikokichi Yasuda of 17-6-F of the death of his son Pfo. Shigeru Yasuda on Nov. 1. Pfo. Yasuda's wife, Mrs. Shizue V. Yasuda, is a Chicago relocatee. Yasuda was formerly of Los Angeles.

Pfc. Cooper Tahara was killed in action, according to notification received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Kumakichi Tahara, 6-2-F. Tahara, who died on Nov. 5, was a resident of Florin before evacuation.

S/Sgt. Jin Ishikawa was slightly wounded on Nov. 4 learned Mr. and Mrs. Saijiro Ishikawa, parents, residents of 7-12-D. It shikawa is from Sacramento.

Former resident of Hynes, Pvt. Kunio J. Shimamo to was slightly wounded on Nov. 6. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Kumago Shimamoto, 29-6-B.

Also slightly wounded on Nov. 14 was T/Sgt. Davo Kawagoye from Los Angeles. His mother, Mrs. Tsuru Inquye, formerly of 4-5-C; and her other sons have relecated to Manzanola, Colo.

On Nov. 6 Pfc. Frank T. Fujino received slight wounds. His mother, Mrs. Tomo Fujino, lives in 4-11.

The telegram informing the death in action of Pfc. Joe Nishimoto on Nov. 14 was received by his sister, Marie Nishimoto, now relocated in Chicago, Ill. Formerly from Bowles, Cal., his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Gioth Nishimoto, live in 28-12-B.

# ONCE OVERS BY BEAN TAKEDA

A friend tells me he's in a rut and doesn't know how to get out. That seems to be a common disease around here. Webster defines rut as "a routine method of action or procedure from which one is not easily stirred."

But it is easy to stir yourself out of a rut, if you know how. It's simple. There's nothing to it. I feel that I'm qualified to speak on the subject, because I'm the champion rut-getter-into in these parts.

Bocause of my humanitarian interests and my natural desire to be of service to my follow men, I'll let you in on my little secret. The procedure is ridiculously simple.

First, you sit down and analyze the situation. Find out what caused you to get into the rut. Was it caused by worry over something? Was it caused by doing the same thing over and over again such as daily household chores or routine office work?

This analyzing is important, because being in a rut is purely a mental state. If you think you're in a rut, you are. If you don't think you're in a rut, you're not. And if you think you are, knowing what caused it is half the battle.

We are all creatures of habit. We like to do things in the same way day after day, mainly because we are too lazy to change those habits. We are reluctant to change them, even when we find ourselves falling into a rut. That brings us down to the second step in the process.

Having discovered what caused your state of mind, you proceed to outline a sot of plans to pull yourself out of it. The whole idea behing this step is to plan to do everything differently. Plan to live two or three days, even a week, in a radically different manner from your u-

Here I am in an ole French house cradling a home-made stove, made from an old bucket, trying to keep warm. This is the first time I've been half way warm in over a month. I just came offthe lines for a short breather and was ever so happy to receive the swell package that you were so thoughtful to send me. I'm really enjoying everything with the follo soldiers in my platoon, thanks a million. We had our first snow of the season a fow days ago and the countryside is really beautiful, but definitely cold. The going is really tough now, with the cold winter setting in and a very determined enemy.

Yesterday I had my first shower and clothing exchange in over a month and I really feel clean. Also I got part of my winter clothing so I should be a little warmer the next time I hit the lines, which I hope isn't too soon. It rained nearly overy day that we were on the lines and life was really miserable. You can't begin to imagine what the boys are going thru out hero. Outside the mobile Red Cross is playing sweet Hawaiian music and I hear that we'll have hot donuts and coffee in a few minutes. Yes it's these little things that help us forget the days of hardships we had to endure. And with all of you back home rooting for us we've really got something to fight fight for. You'te all doing a fine piece of work by keeping the Bussei movement alive, keep up the good work. Thanks again for the swell package, until we meet again, take care. The boys all say thanks, too.

Sunday afternoon's game was played in chilly weather with the Blue Devil Jrs. victorious over the Polka Dot eleven, 7-0.


