## Mrs. Norman Kobayashi Tells Opinion Of California Trip

Just back from a short business trip to her home town, Gardena, Cal., Mrs. Norman Kobayashi of Block 38 opined that the sentiment of the common people of Southern California was not good toward those of Japanese ancestry. On the other hand, personal friends, and those educated, were more than understanding, hospitable and kind, inviting her to luncheons, offering accommodations, and thinking of her welfare.

While Mrs. Kobayashi emphasized that those were just her own opinions gathered during her brief visit to Gardena, Los Angeles, and vicinities, which took

her away from Rohwer from the 3rd to the 22nd of November, she imparted that the crowding transient laborers, Mexicans, Negroes, Oklahomans, and others, abetted disfavor of return of evacuees. Three chief factors contributing to the unfavorable attitude were enumerated as economic interests, "anti" propaganda and family members in the Pacific theater of war. She felt that acceptance will be favorable after the war, but not likely until then.

It was a rainy stay, as Mrs. Kobayashi went about her business of disposing some property which was found most admirably stored by WRA. Striking her as singularly changed since pre-evacuation was the extremely congested condition, housing being so scarce that in one instance a family was seen making a gasoline station their home. Schools were overcrowded; teachers and doctors much too few. Her friends all asserted that evacuation hampered their supply of vegetables and flowers.

Mrs. Kobayashi's husband, Capt. Norman Kobayashi, is now stationed at a Medical hospital somewhere in France.

## COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES

All food taken out of the warehouse will be counted against the 45% per day for a person allotment. Anything accumulated in mess hall storerooms will also be included in the allotment. Since July 1 a new ruling for food supply has been in effect. In order to check the unnecessary flow of food out of the warehouse, and protect the welfare of the Center, a system to approve the requisitions for food by private groups or individuals must be created.

The food committee of the Council was authorized to investigate and grant or reject such requisitions for food.

# STORY OF NISEI GIVEN RACINE GIRL RESERVES

Racine, Wis.—Stressing the loyalty of the Japanese Americans to the United States, Mrs. George Isoda of Milwaukee was the main speaker at the Racine Girl Reserve conference on November 29. Mrs. Isoda is the sister-in-law of Ruth Isoda, former Rohwerite now in Racine.

Approximately 200 persons heard Mrs. Isoda tell the story of the evacuation, resettlement, and the double battle being fought by Nisei soldiers in the U.S. Army.

"Nisei soldiers are fighting not only against the enemy but also against racial discrimination in order that all of us Japanese Americans may have our parts in the future of this country."

"She certainly rang the bell," was one listener's comment.

The exhibition football game by Rohwer Hi football players scheduled for last Wednesday on the McGohee high school gridiron was rained out. It is to be played later.


