The year was 1939, and the place was little Tokio in Los Angeles. He was just out of the University of California, in nearby Westwood, where he had rade a fine record as a student and as a promising officers in the Roserve Officers Training Corps.

He and I used to have many a discussion on the future of the Nisei. The Iwaki drugstore fountain, in the heart of Little Tokio, was the popular meeting place for the Nisei. It was there that we could perch ourselves on the seats and over a cherry coke, or a cup of black coffee, telk over the affairs of the Nisei and of the world.

Our informal chinfosts rarely lasted over an hour or so, because we generally got together at luncheime or at customary coffee-and donat intermission at four o'clock. But they were interesting sessions, because he was an interesting young man.

Ceme the war and evacuation, and he was sent to the Pomona Assembly Center and I to Santa Anita. We corresponded once or twice, but they were feeble attempts. And when he went to Heart Mountain and I came to these Arkansas marshes, we lost complete track of one another.

Then, early this year a soldier from Camp Shelby chanced to tell me that my confubmate was at the Mississippi cantenment... He was a lieutenant new and doing nicely. I immediately sat down and wrote him a long, mostalgic: letter, reminissing about our coke and coffee days.

Back came an answer in a couple of weeks, but it wasn't a letter. It was an announcement of his marriage. It seems that, on his furlough, he had hastoned back to Heart Mountain and taken a bride after a brief, whirlwind courtship. Ho was now getting roady to embark for everses. I didn't hear from him

(Continued from Page 3) after that. But last August, while I was in Charleston (West Va.) on my three-month jaunt thru the eastern cities, I received word of his death in action in Italy.

He had died a here's death. He was leading his platoon, in an attack on a hill near Castellina, Italy, when they were pinned down by intense enemy fire. There was little cover for the advancing Nisel troops, and the consentrated fire threatened the entire company.

The enemy's automatic weapons had to be knocked out. The young lieutenant said he and his men would do the job, and he led his platoon forward about 300 yards. Suddenly, a German automatic gun caught them by surprise on their flank, and my friend fell wounded.

I sat down and wrote a long letter to his wife. I told her of the esteem with which her husband's friends had held him and of our grief at his death. And back came her answer, softand touching but filled with urmistakable pride in her husband. She said:


