

## LOCAL NISEI AMONG G.I.'S COMMENDED

WITH THE 442nd COMBAT TEAM, SEVENTH ARMY IN FRANCE--Forty Japanese American soldiers have received a 34th Infantry Division Commendation for successfully completing a 30-mile reconnaissance patrol in the vicinity of Pisa, Italy.

The patrol was comprised of members of the 442nd Japanese American Combat Team, now fighting with the Seventh Army in north-eastern France. At the time of this particular action, the 442nd was attached to the 34th "Red Bull" Infantry Division, with the Fifth Army in Italy.

Among those mentioned in the Commendation were Staff Sgt. William I. Imamoto and Pfc. Robert T. Kishi, both of whom have parents residing here.

Twenty-six-year-old, Seattle-born Sgt. Imamoto was inducted in November, 1941, at Port Orchard, Washington. His mother, Mrs. Suyoko Imamoto, resides at 38-9-B, while a sister, Mrs. Alice Fujinami, lives at 38-10-A.

Pfc. Kishi is 27, Stockton-born, was inducted in August, 1943. His father, Yakumatsu Kishi, and a younger sister, Joanne, live at 27-5-B.

Told of the good news, Joanne evinced surprise, exclaimed:

"My brother never mentioned a word about it in his letters."

Their citation reads, in part:

"For exceptionally meritorious conduct in combat on the 20th and 21st of July, 1944, in the vicinity of Pisa, Italy. The patrol was instructed to reconnoiter the area around Pisa. Every member of the

More information concerning relocation will be given from time to time.

Preliminary steps in the direction of a resegregation program at the Tule Lake Center are being taken in the light of the revocation orders. All persons now residing in Tule Lake who are eligible to leave the center will be so notified and will be urged to relocate as soon as possible. However, those among the eligibles who wish to transfer to another center pending completion of their relocation plans will be permitted to do so.

The Department of Justice has recently held hearings at Tule Lake for a number of residents who have applied to renounce their American citizenship under the Federal law enacted last July. Those whose applications for renunciation have already

## SUBSISTANCE GRANT ISSUE

Relocation subsistence grants (those provided at the rate of \$25 per person) and subsistence grants while en route (\$3 per day) are available, as previously, only to center residents (including those who have previously relocated and who have been reinducted in accordance with established procedure) and only in cases of need. Travel grants and transportation of personal property, however, are being more widely extended.

Without reference to individual need they are available according to types of eligibles and points to which they may relocate on the following basis:

1. Center residents on the Army's cleared list may relocate to any point in the United States, Alaska

But many of the questions will involve problems in policy and procedure. Such questions will undoubtedly be of interest to countless others in the center.

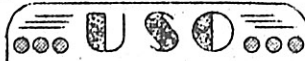
The thought occurs to us that it might be a practical idea to install a question box in each mess hall. The residents could then write out their \$64 questions on slips of paper and drop them into these boxes.

or Hawaii.

2. Center residents designated for exclusion but not on the Army's stop list may relocate to any point outside the evacuated area.

3. Former Center residents now out on indefinite leave and not excluded by the Western Defense Command may relocate to any point within the State or portion of State from which the applicant was originally evacuated.

4. Voluntary evacuees not excluded by the Western Defense Command may relocate to any point within the State or portion of State from which the applicant was originally evacuated.

In all cases, relocation plans must be approved before travel grants and property transportation can be made available. In the case of center residents, plans may be approved at the center except where advance approval of the Relocation officer is required. In the case of those who were out on in-

definite leave at the time of the announcement of the revocation orders, approval must be obtained from the nearest field relocation officer. Those who were put on indefinite leave at that time and have since returned to the centers will have to get approval from the relocation officer nearest to the point where they resided prior to their return.

been approved by the Attorney General have been transferred to an alien enemy internment camp.

The cases of other center residents both at Tule Lake and the relocation centers, who are designated by the War Department as ineligible for relocation will be reviewed by the War Department. Those who are still found ineligible for relocation after review will be segregated in a center or centers (not yet designated) that will ultimately be administered by the Justice Department.

Applications to the Spanish Embassy for expatriation or repatriation or any other similar action that might formerly have been the basis for suspension of leave clearance will no longer be grounds

All visitors in the Center whose visiting permits expire after January 2 are requested to go to the Relocation office and make applications for extensions of their permits.

This also applies to those who came in without permits.

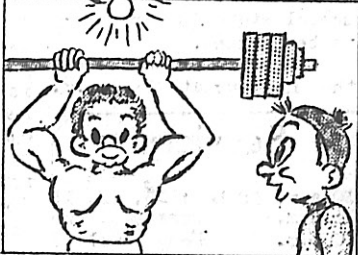

## 聖路易一新聞の正論

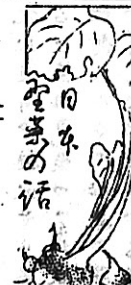
