2nd Lt. Masuo Chomori, Nisei war hero who was wounded in October in France, had returned to the United States Dec. 29 and has been hospitalized at the Army Air Force Regional hospital in Miami, Fla., according to his wife, Mrs. Elsie Chomori of 12-6-F.

Awarded the Purple Heart, Chomori, who received wounds in his left thigh, is now able to walk on crutches. He was commissioned a second lieutenant while on the fields of battle.

Mrs. Chomori expects to join him soon in Utah where he will be transferred to a General hospital there.

### *Deny Story Of Attack On Five*

Because of the widespread rumor that a group of evacuees had been attacked in Los Angeles, Project Director Ray D. Johnston wired R. B. Cozzens, assistant director in San Francisco, for a confirmation or denial of the story. The following reply was received from Cozzens:

"Our attention has been called to a malicious rumor that five persons of Japanese ancestry were attacked in several localities in Los Angeles. This is wholly unfounded and judging from the uniformity of the rumor it comes from the same source. We suspect it is a planted rumor to frighten evacuees from returning."

Judson F. Shaw and F. E. Boerner of the Immigration Naturalization Service in New Orleans and Atlanta, respectively, arrived last week and have set up their offices in Ad. Building 2.

Their purpose is to interview aliens before relocating to determine their status under the immigration law.

"People who have come to be interviewed have been very helpful and have cooperated to the fullest extent," according to Shaw.

Alien residents can be of great assistance in facilitating the procedure by coming at the requested time and by bringing their Japanese passport, registration receipt, certificate of identification, and any correspondence with the Immigration Bi-

## POST-EXCLUSION BUL. NO. 2

Further instructions for the post-exclusion program were released by WRA Director Dillon S. Meyer in the Post-exclusion Bulletin No. 2.

### RELOCATION OF UNATTACHED MINOR

In view of the Endo decision, unattached children or children wishing to relocate without being accompanied by or going to responsible relatives cannot be refused permission to leave a center if the War Department has not designated them to be ineligible for relocation. However, WRA has a moral responsibility to them for proper placement. They and any older family members should be advised to consult the Welfare section regarding State laws governing inter-State placement of children.

Further they must have

an approved relocation plan in order to qualify for relocation assistance, and because of their dependency should be strongly urged not to leave until such plan has been developed in any case.

Guides for development of a satisfactory plan are set forth in Administrative Notice No. 130. The specific approval of the Washington office of each plan will not be necessary if the center has definite assurance from the relocation supervisor or relocation officer that the plan complies with the appropriate State law.

### TRAVEL ASSISTANCE

Answering a number of questions that have come up on travel grants and personal property transportation:

1. Relocated evacuees applying for travel assist-

ance in returning to the evacuated area are eligible for grants only if returning to the State or portion of State (i.e. western Washington or Oregon or southern Arizona) from which they were originally evacuated. However, in those (presumably rare) cases where the head of a family was evacuated from one State and his dependents from another, the dependents may now receive grants to accompany the head to his pre-evacuation state of residence.

2. Visitors at the centers cannot apply at the centers for transportation assistance covering return to the evacuated area. They must make application to the field office nearest to the point where they resided before visiting the center.

3. Travel grants for relocated people returning to the evacuated area will be made available only to cover the most direct routing between the point of present residence (e.g. Chicago) and the West Coast destination. If such people wish to stop off at a center en route, any additional travel involved will have to be at their own expenses.

4. Arrangements are being made to provide automobile transportation reimbursement for eligible reloctees returning to the Coast. Such reimbursement will be on the same basis as that now provided for those relocating by automobile directly from the centers.

### HOUSING REQUIREMENTS FOR RELOCATION PLANNING

Because of the acute housing shortage in the evacuated area and the difficulties being experienced by evacuees returning to the West Coast without prior housing arrangements, WRA will require evacuees to show evidence of housing arrangements before approving their relocation plan.

These arrangements may be temporary, but should be for a long enough period of time to permit the evacuees to obtain permanent housing.

### TRAVEL PERMITS FOR HAWAII AND ALASKA

All evacuees desiring to travel to Hawaii or Alaska should hereafter be advised to submit their requests to the Japanese American Branch, Office of the Provost Marshal General, Presidio, San Francisco, Cal.

### LEAVE CLEARANCE

Questions are still coming in about the leave status of individual evacuees. All staff members—both at the centers and in the field offices—should clearly understand that WRA is now out of the leave clearance business.

All future determinations regarding the freedom of movement of individual evacuees will be made either by the War Department or the Department of Justice.
