Commencement Starts at 8 p.m.

To the August strains of "Pomp and Circumstances," 99 seniors will culminate their high school years by receiving their long-awaited diplomas Friday evening at 8 in the Center Auditorium.

Newly elected president and secretary of the National Honor Society, Tomio Muranaka and Terrie Otsubo, will lead the graduates in the Processional.

Dr. R. C. Daily, head of the Quachita College History Department will be the main speaker of the evening.

Diplomas will be presented by Guy Thompson, superintendent of Rohwer schools, assisted by William Beasley, principal of high school.

Platform guests will be Project Director Ray D. Johnston, Director of Community Management E. B. Moulton, President of the School Board Lloyd Shingu and Chairman of Community Council Chester Fujino.

WOUNDED PFC VISITS CTR.

Wounded in his back and left arm when he went out to the front lines in France in October 1944, Pfc. Kenji Akaba, who had been hospitalized in France and then Italy, returned to the United States Dec. 12 and is now with his wife and baby in 8-10-E.

Pfc. Akaba, holder of the Purple Heart, volunteered from San Francisco Jan. 7, 1942, trained at Ft. McClellan, Ala., and went overseas in August 1944 as replacement with the 1st Battalion of the 442nd regimental combat team. He will leave toward the end of this month for the General hospital in El Paso, Tex.

GIVE POST-EXCLUSION BULLETIN NO. 3

Post-exclusion Bulletin No. 3 gives the following information:

SOCIAL VISITS

No visits exclusively for social purposes are to be permitted. However, in cases where an evacuee in a nearby community has valid reasons to visit the center for relocation planning and where his presence is requested by center residents, he may, of course, be admitted.

AGENCIES WANT EX-EMPLOYEES

Several government agencies formerly employing evacuees on the West Coast have inquired of West Coast WRA offices as to the availability of past employees.

It is suggested that all eligible persons wishing federal employment in formerly evacuated areas submit applications to the 12th Civil Service District in San Francisco for California and Arizona or the 11th District in Seattle for Oregon and Washington.

TRAVEL PERMITS

For a short period after December 17, some United States Attorneys were apparently under the impression that they had no authority to issue travel permits to Japanese aliens for travel to the evacuated area. This misunderstanding has been called to the attention of the Justice Department, and instructions are being sent out to all United States Attorneys that they are authorized to issue permits in such cases provided the applicant has not been individually excluded from the evacuated area.

GATE ADMISSION

In most cases where evacuees appear outside the center gates asking permission to visit without having secured advance approval, it seems desirable to admit them temporarily. However, in cases where the would-be visitor obviously does not fall in any of the visitor categories set forth in the Manual, the Project Director is authorized at his own discretion to deny admission at the gate.
