CALIF. ATT'Y GEN.'S MESSAGE

ASKS PROTECTION OF RETURNING EVACUEES

San Francisco, Jan. 18-- Robert W. Kenny, attorney general of California, has written the law enforcement officers of the state calling upon them to see that returning Japanese-American people are given full protection. In his letter he quotes the text of a statement issued by the

State Law Enforcement Advisory Committee after a special meeting called at the suggestion of Governor Earl Warren.

The statement follows: "We consider it our sworn duty as law enforcement officers to fully cooperate with the Army authorities in dealing with

the return of the Japanese residents of this state. All persons, regardless of race, are entitled to the full protection of the law. The Army has carefully investigated each person to be permitted to return and will not allow those who are potentially dangerous to return.

"There should be no difficulty involved in this transition unless incidents are provoked by intemperate words and thoughtlessness.

"During this period of adjustment the reputation of each of our California communities will be at stake. We have faith in the good judgment of the people of California. We confidently expect all citizens to join with us in furthering full respect of the individual rights involved."

Scope of the services the Farm Security Administration (FSA) can make available to returning evacuee farmers has been outlined in a letter sent to WRA by R. W. Hollenberg, regional director of the FSA, it was announced today by R. B. Cozzens, assistant director of WRA.

Before a loan can be made to any applicant the FSA county committee, comprised of three prominent local farmers, must pass on his eligibility, character and integrity, Hollenberg said.

RURAL REHABILITATION OR OPERATING LOANS

Rural rehabilitation or operating loans are available to citizens who qualify as low-income farm families (including owner-operators, tenants, sharecroppers and farm laborers with sufficient family man power for farm and home operations, except possibly at peak seasons) if certain other requirements can be met.

NEW BARRACK ADDED FOR RELOCAT'N DIVISION'S USE

Streamlining the advising and processing features of resettlement, the Relocation Division has extended its office into a new barrack connected with the original building bywalks.

Barrack 1 offices are concerned with the advisory functions of resettlement. Its north end room houses the Resettlement Planning Commission and the Relocation Library. Reception room and advisory offices occupy the four center rooms. Relocation Program Officer G. B. Price and Assistant Relocation Program Officer R. A. Allison are in the south end room.

Leave and transportation offices are in Bar-

rack 2. Though not a part of the Relocation Division the Evacuee Property Office under E. F. Owen is now located there.

Changes were made to handle the accelerated program of the division and to equip it with facilities to render better and speedier service. Additional appointed personnel members are E. B. Browster, Edna A. Miller, James Nelson and Mattie Lou Leflar.

"It is hoped that steps in resettling may be handled in Block 42 so the relocatees will not find it necessary to travel all over the center while making his plans," Price announced.

S. F. WRA REPORTS ON FLORIN, MAYHEW FIRES

In accordance with the established WRA policy to publish details of incidents affecting relocatees, and their property, Victor L. Furth of the San Francisco WRA office sent the following teletype to Project Director Ray D. Johnston on Jan. 24:

"A fire of unknown origin but believed to be incendiary destroyed the home of Fumi Makai-Gila River Project at Florin, California, at 2:30 a.m. Tuesday. Dwelling was insured. Another fire which destroyed the home of Nickey Saiki, Mayhaw, Sa-

cramento County, last Friday was checked and discovered to have been due to faulty flue. House burned down in midday. It was occupied by Caucasian tenants. Adult members of family were not at home but two children, 12 and 14 years of age, left home after witnessing start of fire from inside house. Personal belongings of tenants were lost in fire. Saiki dwelling was insured. Sacramento county board of supervisors today voted to add three deputies to sheriff's staff to give added protection."

GRACE SUMIDA REPORTS OPPORTUNITIES IN L.A.

Conditions in Southern California, particularly in Los Angeles and East Los Angeles, seemed outwardly the same, Grace Sumida, former Rohwerian now of Cincinnati, O., remarked Tuesday when she stopped here en route following a short visit to the West Coast Dec. 5-21.

Will Organize Adult Classes

Mrs. Grace Kurata is requesting all who wish to learn English to meet her in the west wing of the Auditorium, Monday, at 9 a.m. Several new classes will be organized next week.

In order to meet the needs of men who feel that they will need to learn English before they can be independent in work after they relocate, new classes for men are being organized.

On the whole it was an enjoyable trip--reception courteous, neighbors friendly, people impersonal, and weather fair. Noticeable amount of soot from the newly sprung up factories seemed an alien intruder.

In her opinion, evacuees with established contacts in Los Angeles--friends and guaranteed housing and security--should find it healthy to return to the West Coast; however, those without these foundations may find it difficult to start anew. Housing is acute; jobs still range in the unskilled labor group--gardening, domestics. The prevailing impression of WRA officials: there was that evacuees who have established themselves in their talented professions or trades east of the Rockies would prefer to stay put instead of returning to California. The West Coast WRA offices are now making contacts to get job offers for evacuees in all fields.

During her spare time from settling property business matters, Miss Sumida visited the Hillcrest Sanitarium in La Crescenta, Cal., where there are 105 patients of Japanese descent, took in both Chinese and Pachoo dances at the International House and shopped at the Downtown L.A. stores. She said that the WRA is working on the provision of storage for there is no space in Los Angeles at present.

Miss Sumida, former supervisor of clubs and organizations of CA, will go back to Cincinnati Monday.

Post-Exclusion Bulletin Number 4, Part 3, follows: CONTRABAND REGULATIONS

The Proclamation rescinding the mass exclusion orders also revoked Public Proclamation No. 3 which made certain articles, including camera and short-wave radio sets, contraband in the possession of any person of Japanese ancestry in the Western Defense Command States. Presidential Proclamation No. 2525 and the regulations of the Department of Justice on contraband, however, which apply to all aliens of enemy nationality, remain effective.

The War Relocation Authority will upon request aid citizen evacuees in all centers in recovering possession of cameras. Those who apply for the return of cameras should be informed that the cameras are still contraband in the possession of Japanese aliens and that it is unlawful for them to make the cameras available to such aliens under any conditions. Short-wave radio sets shall continue to be prohibited in all centers as a matter of WRA regulation. The Authority, however, will continue to ship and otherwise assist center residents in recovering short-wave radio sets on certification by the Project Director at the center that

N.Y. OFFERS OPPORTUNITIES

WRA Report Gives Opinions Of Issei Businessmen

New York City offers to Issei resettlers a wide variety of excellent business opportunities in consumer industries and service trades, according to a report of the opinions of 30 New York business men and women of Japanese ancestry which has just been issued by the WRA relocation office in New York City. The business people who cooperated in the survey offered to ad-

vice Issei evacuees regarding business opportunities in New York, and invited correspondence from them.

Copies of the English edition of the report, entitled "Business Opportunities for Issei in New York City," are now available from the relocation program office. A Japanese edition of the report is also being prepared for distribution.

The business people who were interviewed, mostly Issei, recommended the following types of businesses for Issei newcomers to New York: (restaurants, small rooming houses, art goods, dental laboratories, soda fountain, pet shop, toy factories, Oriental food stores, florists, produce, specialty foods, dry cleaning, dressmaking, dress shop, novelty store, manufacture of art and specialty goods, handkerchief shop, nurseries, photographic studios, small truck gardens, and watch repair shop.

The Issei and Nisei indicated that they gave experienced little if any racial discrimination, even during the period shortly after the outbreak of war, and that their businesses have been prospering during the past few years, mostly through Caucasian trade. Most of them have been in business in New York or vicinity for at least 15 years, and eight have operated their establishments for at least 25 years, according to the report. It also points out that New York has a total of some 100 businesses owned by persons of Japanese origin and that these firms are located in all parts of the city, including such well known sections as Broadway, 42nd Street, Rockefeller Center, and Fifth Avenue.

The following type of businesses are owned by persons who cooperated in the study and gift shop, restaurants, dental laboratories, fish market, retail florist, artist, photographer, Oriental food stores, general merchandise, bowling alley, nursery, and plants which manufacture artificial flowers, picture frames, lamp shades, and art goods.

Interviews with owners of these businesses are summarized in the report. One section of it points out that their children have been favorably received in New York City's schools and colleges.

These other requirements include: the necessity of full-time farm operations, effectively utilizing family manpower or part-time operations which may be supplemented by off-farm employment and a satisfactory level of living; a willingness to assume the necessary responsibilities in order to make an effective contribution to the Nation's war effort; a family background of rural experience and managerial ability; that the borrower be unable to obtain adequate farm and home financing at reasonable rates and terms from sources other than the FSA; that there be a reasonable possibility of repaying the loan and that the family's

level of health and living can be maintained or improved.

Heads of families eligible as standard borrowers can get loans for livestock, farm equipment, minor repairs and improvements for farm and/or home, participation in group health, hospital and/or dental services, for emergency health services and for occupation of physical conditions when the approved farm and home plan indicates that such expenditures are necessary to successfully conduct the family's war production program and rehabilitation of the farm family.

However, loans will not be made for refinancing, generally speaking although exceptions may be made.

WATER FACILITIES LOANS

Water facilities loans, which run up to 20 years at three percent interest, are available to farm families for repairing, rebuilding or constructing farm and irrigation water systems, provided the family cannot secure adequate financing from other sources.

GROUP SERVICES LOANS

Group services loans are available to farmers wishing to pool their resources for the purchase and use of services and equipment, such as purebred sires and machinery which they can not afford to own individually. These loans carry three per cent interest and run for a period not to exceed the lifetime of the facility purchased.

Assistance can be extended, however, to any needy relocatee—citizen or alien—under the special Resettlement Assistance Program administered by the Social Security Board. This program is being carried forward with funds appropriated by Congress specifically for assistance to persons "affected by restrictive governmental action" and is not subject to State variations.

BASKETBALL:

During the winter month of 1891, Dr. James Naismith, then Director of Physical Education at Springfield, Illinois Y.M.C.A., seeing a lull in gymnasium activities among its members struck on ideas with the result; he hung two baskets, one each on opposite end of the gym wall, somewhat higher than the average height of man. He divided the single group into two different groups and handing them a large inflated ball similar to the medicineball or the volleyball, pitted one group against each other and instructed them to see which of the group can ring the basket most.

This in that winter month of 1891, Dr. Naismith invented a new game which late was to be named "Basketball" and which in less than 50 years was to become one of the most popular National Sports in America. When statistics were taken of the five most popular sports—namely, Baseball, Basketball, Football, Racing and Boxing—at the end of 1939-40 season, it was found that more than eighty million (80,000,000) fans all over America watched more than sixty thousand (60,000) teams play one million five hundred thousand (1,500,000) games of basketballs. Comparatively on attendance, this was practically thirty million (30,000,000) more than baseball, forty million (40,000,000) more than football and fifty million (50,000,000) more than football and fifty million (50,000,000) more than boxing or racing.

Figures were based on statistics taken at end of 1939-40 season last year under which the sports were played under normal conditions.

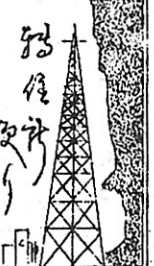
