SNELLING MEN TO HELP WITH FAMILY PLANS

Approximately 78 soldiers from Fort Snelling, Minnesota, will visit the Rohwer Center on Furlough to assist their families in making relocation plans. Their furloughs begin to day and are good only for 7 days.

The Relocation division is very anxious to assist these soldiers with any relocation plan which they may have for their families. We will appreciate it if the families concerned will make use of the services of the Relocation division in El Paso.

MYER ON AVAILABILITY OF INSURANCE IN CALIF.

Dillon Myer gave the following reply to Project Director Ray D. Johnston in answer to his request for information concerning the availability of automobile and fire insurance for evacuees returning to California and the possibility of their securing business licenses particularly where aliens are involved.

"There was some reluctance on the part of a number of insurance companies immediately after Pearl Harbor to insure evacuee property, and we experienced some initial difficulty in getting fire insurance coverage for the business enterprises at several of the centers. However, with the progress of the war and the clarification of the rights of the evacuees, this difficulty has subsided to a large extent. Our San Francisco office has a list of insurance companies that have been willing to insure evacuee property. As individual relocation plans involving this question come to your attention, I suggest that you refer the questions to the San Francisco office or the appropriate Area office for investigation.

SPECIAL CHAIR CAR FOR CAL. RETURNEES

In response to requests from Center residents for a special chair car to transport persons relocating to California, plans have now been worked out with the Missouri Pacific Railway Company to furnish a chair car and, probably, a Pullman, if needed, Robert A. Allison, assistant relocation program officer, announced yesterday.

All persons wishing to return to California by March 23 and who wish to travel in group like this should contact the Relocation Office before close of work March 12 to complete arrangements. Persons traveling on this plan worked out with the

Missouri Pacific Railway Company will board the first car at Rohwer on the evening of March 23. It will then be attached to a through train at Little Rock, Arkansas, and taken to California. After arriving at California, persons will then transfer to other railroad lines which will take them to their respective home towns. Both Pullman and coach must be filled to a reasonable

T/SGT. TANOUYE GIVEN D.S.C. POSTHUMOUSLY

Mr. and Mrs. Mikuma Tanouye, 16-1-A, have been informed by the Adjutant General of the United States, J. A. Ulio, that their son, Technical Sergeant Ted T. Tanouye, has been posthumously awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, the Nation's second highest decoration, by direction of the President.

Sgt. Tanouye who was reported killed in action on Sept. 4 in Italy, was formerly of Torrance, Calif. The Tanouyes are Danson Transferees.

The citation detailing his courageous exploits follows:

"For extraordinary heroism in action on 7 July 1944, near --, Italy. Technical Sergeant Tanouye led his platoon in an attack to capture the crest of a strategically important hill which afforded little cover or concealment. No-

tiating an enemy machine gun crew placing its gun in position at his left front, Technical Sergeant Tanouye crept forward a few yards and opened fire on the position, killing or wounding three and causing two others to disperse. Immediately an enemy machine pistol opened fire on him, but he returned the fire and killed or wounded three more Germans. While advancing forward, Technical Sergeant Tanouye was subjected to grenade bursts, and his left arm was rendered useless by a fragment. Sighting an enemy trench, he raked the position with fire from his submachine gun and wounded several of the enemy. Running out of ammunition he crawled twenty yards to obtain several clips from a comrade on his left flank. Next, sighting an enemy machine pistol (Continued on page 2)

ROHWERITES WITH 442nd BN. AWARDED MEDAL

Two soldiers from Rohwer with the 442nd Japanese American Combat Team, Pfc. Sueo Takahashi of 23-8-E and Pfc. Minoru Sasaki of 26-10-D, were awarded the Good Conduct Medal recently for exemplary conduct during the past year or more, with 19 others from the various centers.

All have earned the Combat Infantryman's Badge for outstanding performance under enemy fire and most of the men have two or more battle stars for participation in the Italian and Southern France campaigns. Many also wear the Purple Heart, some with oak leaf clusters, said the report from the 6th Army Group in France.

which had pinned down his men, Technical Sergeant Tanouye crawled forward a few yards and threw a hand grenade into the position silencing it. He then located another machine gun firing down the slope of the hill, opened fire and silenced this position. Drawing fire from a machine pistol nest located above him, he opened fire and wounded three of its occupants. Finally taking his objective Technical Sergeant Tanouye organized a defensive position on the reverse slope of the hill before accepting first aid treatment and evacuation. His fighting determination and intrepidity in battle exemplify the finest traditions of the Armed Forces of the United States."

NEW ORLEANS---This is a quaint city. In fact, it is one of the quaintest and most interesting cities in the country. It ranks right along with San Francisco and New York in that respect. There is something about these port cities that set them apart from the other port and inland towns. New Orleans, for instance, has a certain flavor and tang, a definite color all its own.

Take the French quarters, for instance. It is the oldest and perhaps the most colorful part of the city. We walked thru there last night, strolled thru its narrow, dirty streets, with its large frame houses, weather-beaten buildings, and its lacy ironworks. We peeked in on its scores of eating houses, gift and antique shops, beer parlors, night clubs, bars, and dives. In many respects, it reminds me of Greenwich Village in New York.

Some parts of New Orleans remind me of San Gabriel valley or San Fernando valley near Los Angeles. The climate, too, is similar, though, perhaps, it's a bit sultrier here. In the winter, the thermometer seldom drops to freezing. No need for long flannels here. I'm not promoting relocation here, but I will admit that this is a good spot for ex-Californians who prefer mild weather.

Canal Street here is the wildest in the country. It's 171 feet from curb to curb. San Francisco's famous Market Street is only about 150 feet wide. Paradoxically, though, most of the other streets in New Orleans are narrow. Many are one-way thru-fares. There are many so-called "oyster streets" here. Whenever these narrow, dirt side-streets get too full of holes, the city fills them up with oyster shells. They're cheaper than gravel.

D.S. MYER DISCUSSES BUSINESS LICENSES

"So far as business licenses in California are concerned, there is a large number of State statutes and city ordinances which require licenses to conduct many various types of professions, trades, and occupations. Inquiries about specific callings in particular localities should be referred to the appropriate area office for investigation and report. Generally speaking persons of Japanese ancestry, including aliens, are as eligible as other persons residing in the United States for licenses to conduct ordinary businesses, and refusal to grant licenses to them solely because of their ancestry or alien status would be a denial of the equal protection of the extends to aliens as well as to citizens. There are certain professions, and certain callings that are affected with a public interest, from which aliens may be excluded by statute or permitted to enter under special conditions, but these professions and callings are limited in number."

The parks here are beautiful. Even now, the grass is a deep green, and camellias, azaleas, pansies, and various other posies are blooming. The trees are hung with the silken Spanish moss, which are green here and which give an enchanting effect. Sort of a spring wonderland. One of the main streets here has a divided lane in the center, called the Floral Trail, along which are blooming endless number of camellia bushes, magnolias, and other flowers and blossoms.

The food stores here are, for the most part, small and unattractive. The fruit markets can't compare with those in California. Chance for some enterprising person to do a nice business here. This city could stand a good Oriental restaurant, too.

We visited Tulane University and its famous Sugar Bowl, and rode past the "Gone With the Wind" house, so called because a local doctor, who is a great admirer of Author Margaret Mitchell, built it as an exact duplicate of Tara, Scarlett O'Hara's home in the famous book. He drove out to Lake Pontchartrain and saw the Naval training station, where Robert Taylor is now stationed, and also saw the Consolidated-Vultee aircraft plant, where they turn out those PBV flying boats.
