James Sugioka, of Indianapolis, will speak informally on his recent trip to California, where he met with the Committee on American Principles and Fair Play in San Francisco. Chairman will be Harper Sakae.

NISEI SYMPOSIUM

An all-Nisei symposium on "We Look at Resettlement," featuring an array of outstanding local speakers, will highlight the evening meeting at 7:30 p.m. at Mess hall 35. Speakers will include Mrs. Mae Honda, PTA leader; Dr. Roy Tanaka, hospital staff physician; Bean Takeda, Reports division; Sugioka, and a visiting serviceman.

Edith Chikaraishi will be chairman for the program, which will be rounded out with entertainment by local talent and topped off with a showing of the film, "Go For Broke."

Saturday morning will be devoted to discussions, which will take place at the high school from 8:30 a.m. to noon. A luncheon program is slated for noon at the high school mess, with Elso Ito as chairman.

Discussions will be resumed from 1:30 to 3:30, followed by a panel discussion assembly in the high school mess. Composing the panel of experts will be Bill Hosokawa, A. B. Thompson, James Sugioka, and Dr. Nat Griswold.

TWO REPORTED AS CASUALTIES ON WEST FRONT

According to a War Department telegram, Pfc. Yoshio Hiraoka, 26, was slightly wounded on Jan. 27 in France.

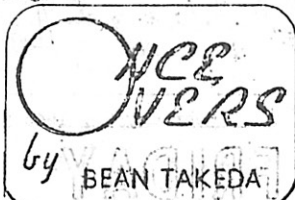
Pfc. Hiraoka, son of Mr. and Mrs. Yoichi Hiraoka, 4-11-F, was formerly of Harbor City. He joined the U. S. armed services in January 1941 at Newark, Cal., and left for overseas duty in August 1944.

The Akisane Yaguchis of 32-2-A were also advised of the slight wounding of their son, Pvt. John Yaguchi, on Feb. 9.

The 19-year-old private is a graduate of Rohwer High school's class of '43. Leaving for active duty in June 1944, the former Angeleno trained in Camp Robinson and Camp Blanding. He was sent to the European theater early this year, receiving his wounds in France.

ARSONISTS TO BE PUT ON TRIAL

There was sufficient evidence against them to hold them for trial. Date of their Superior Court trial will be set later. In the meantime, there will be a hearing in Superior Court on Mar. 3 to determine whether or not the surety bonds posted by the two local brothers are sufficient in view of the serious nature of the charges. The other two brothers, held, both AWOL from the Army, are still in jail because of inability to make bond. State Department of Justice is watching case carefully as are we."



Good slogan for you campeople who have friends, sweethearts, or relatives overseas: "If you don't write, you're wrong!"... When the 442nd boys were still training at Camp Shelby, Gen. George Marshall paid a surprise visit to the Mississippi cantonment and reviewed the Nisei soldiers. Afterwards, he sought out a captain and inquired: "What's the idea of parading all the little men ahead of the little men?" Explained the captain: "It's the sergeant's fault, sir. He used to manage a fruit market in California."

The Native Daughters of the Golden West are still busy. Aside from protesting against fishing rights for Nisei, they are requesting more Federal funds be allocated for FBI work in California. They feel that returning evacuees should be "much more thoroughly investigated than has been done to date"... A large Pacific coast fruit growers association, which distributes fruits and vegetables on an outright or consignment basis, has flatly refused to handle produce grown by Japanese Americans.

Toyoko Murayama, 19-year-old Nisei evicted from Chicago's Jackson Park hospital, is a Red Cross blood donor and has an uncle and brother in the service. Dr. Selig A. Shevin, her physician who resigned from the staff of the hospital in protest against the desorimnatory action, had served the hospital for 17 years and is a World War veteran. He has received scores of letters congratulating him on his stand. Windy City papers, notably the Chicago Sun, have carried stories and editorials in support of the Nisei and the doctor. Just as in the Hood River incident, the ultimate re-

PROPER PROCEDURE FOR RATION BOOK ISSUANCE

The proper procedure for issuing War Ration Books 3 and 4 was announced by James F. Ruins, assistant project director, for the benefit of all those getting ready to relocate.

Applications for War Ration Books 3 and 4 must be signed by the applicant at the ration desk in the Relocation office. Applications for Ration Book No. 3 are then mailed to the Little Rock OPA office where the books are issued and mailed direct to the applicants. It usually takes 3 days from the date of application for the Ration Book 3 to be received by the applicant. One day before the date of depart-

ture, the applicant should present Ration Book No. 3 to this office and Ration Book No. 4 will be issued here. It cannot be issued earlier than one day prior to the date of departure except in the case of persons leaving on Monday morning in which case the book will be issued Saturday morning.

Persons who have previously been issued ration books and have turned them in at this office may receive them by calling for them one day prior to the date of departure.

All persons who call for Ration Book No. 4 should present their route slips to this office which will show the date of departure.

POST-EXCLUSION BULLETIN

Post-Exclusion Bulletin Number 5, part 3, follows:

VISITS TO CENTERS BY PAROLEES

We have advised the Immigration and Naturalization Service that paroled internees will no longer be inducted as regular residents of relocation centers.

This is in accord, of course, with the general post-exclusion policy on inductions and reinductions. However, any internees who may be paroled in the future will have the privilege of visiting the centers for a period of not more than 30 days

for relocation planning purposes. The Immigration and Naturalization Service has been advised that sponsorship arrangements should be made for the parolees before they leave the internment camps and that those desiring to visit the centers for relocation planning should secure advance approval (by submitting a Form WRA-388) from the appropriate Project Director. At the centers these applications should be processed by having the Relocation Division determine whether the parolee's visit is actually needed for relocation planning purposes. Approval of the nearest field office, however, will not be required, and guest charges should not be made where the Project Director gives advance approval. The Immigration and Naturalization Service has been furnished with a supply of WRA-388's for distribution to the internment camps, according to the bulletin.

西部沿岸帰還と一般転住の現況

本日内務長官ムケス氏の発表する処に依れば去る正月二日迄退令が一般に停止された以来既に五百人の日傭人が中部沿岸に帰還した。転住局記録は去る一月十七日に至る七週間の間、同日中に令人が退令に於て内附した三万三千の復を達つて冬米に約半轉住新を去つた事を示して居る。加へて六十六名の壯丁が現復に編入された。

此の割合で再び歸還に当るに於て最新漸々の下し方も静穏にとの予想を裏書きするものである。此の七週間に東部及中西部より歸還した者も右数字以外に少数あり、又五百世九名の西部歸還者中大多数は家族連れれて四百十五名は加州へ四十三名は華州、世三名、央州、世二名はアリゾナ州へ歸還した。東部へ転住した千二百名の内訳はイリノイ州三百五十二、オハイオ州廿八、ミシガン州七十八、コロラド州八十八、ユージージーシー州六十三、強部は二名より六十名の割合でシエラネバダ山脈

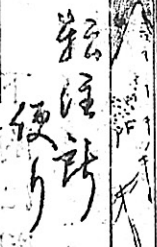
