WAR FIELD PROMOTIN FOR NISEI SOLDIER OBSERVE 2ND ANNIVERSARY

The battlefield promotion of 2nd Lt. Kenneth Masamitsu from a technical sergeant to his present rank while in the Vosges was reported in a dispatch from the Sixth Army Group in France detailing the 442nd Japanese American Combat Team's assault to rescue the Texas "Lost Battalion."

Masamitsu was in charge of six bazooka teams of the Second Battalion Headquarters which relieved a forward company of the 442nd which was being threatened by enemy forces surrounding the "Lost Battalion."

One hundred yards from their destination they were pinned down by a heavy concentration of artillery fire. After directing his men to cover, the lieutenant proceeded alone with

the ammunition and safely deposited the load. He then returned and carried a seriously wounded man to a safe position and rendered first aid. He then skillfully led his bazooka teams to the front lines. The Lieutenant's leadership and accurate judgement in placing the bazooka teams helped to repulse the German counterattack.

Formerly of Los Angeles, Masamitsu has a sister, Mrs. Y. Yamashita, in 14-5-A.

Dr. Kikuo Taira, of the local hospital staff chaired the group on social action. The delegates discussed the problem of wartime marriages, cited the numerous disadvantages as against the advantages, came to the conclusion that they were inadvisable.

From there, the conference went on to the problems of intermarriage and pondered it long and hard. Conclusions intermarriage is an individual problem.

ARK. WILSON PLANTATION MANAGER TO VISIT CENTER

John Crain, manager of the Wilson Plantation at Wilson, Ark., will be in the Center next Friday, March 16th. The Wilson Plantation is, no doubt, the largest plantation in the South under the management of one individual.

There are 65,000 acres under cultivation on this plantation. This concern owns its own canning plant and has stated that they plan to put in a quick-freezing plant very soon. They have good housing and mechanized equipment, according to C. B. Price, relocation program officer.

Crain wants to discuss the possibility of working out some sort of a plan with the evacuees here in the Center. It is hoped that farming leaders in the community will plan to be at the meeting at 2:30 p.m. Friday in the Resettlement Planning Commission office, 42-2-B-11. "The land on this plantation is some of the most productive land in the world," Price said.

NO FURTHER REINDUCTIONS

Although reinduction of excludees was permitted originally under terms of 150.1.10A, this policy is now being changed to prohibit all further reinductions or inductions of new residents to the relocation centers. Hereafter relocated excludees will be treated in the same manner as other relocated persons and will be eligible only to visit the centers in accordance with the procedure of 150.1.10 and not for readmission. Evacuees out on seasonal, short-term, or trial, indefinite leave, of course, are still regarded as center residents so that, strictly speaking, the question of reinduction does not apply to them.

Moreover, there are two special classes of evacuees who may be readmitted to the centers as residents, upon approval of the National Director even though they were granted indefinite leave prior to Decem-

BEAN TAKEDA

Recent movie titled "Double Indemnity" recalls a double indemnity case involving a Nisei soldier, the this one had nothing to do with murder. The GI died last Dec. 28 at Camp Blanding in a manner and from causes which authorities will not disclose. He carried a double indemnity policy with a large New York insurance firm. The policy, issued in Oct. of 1939, carried an exception clause concerning death by "war or any act incident thereto." The \$64 question is: does his death, occurring in a way which the War Dept. will not reveal, entitle the beneficiary to double indemnity?

Were it not for evacuation, the boy would have continued operating the vineyard and received a deferment. As it is, he has to go off to war, while his mother and sister wonder where they can relocate, and how.

Price Steiding, relocation officer in charge.

(Continued from page 2) ber 20, 1944, or left on terminal departure after that date. Evacuees in this special classification who may gain readmission are (1) men who left to report for U. S. Army pre-induction physical examination or induction and who have subsequently been rejected or placed in the enlisted reserve corps, and (2) evacuees who were sent out to enter hospitals or other similar institutions merely because proper facilities for their care were not available at the center, and who are subsequently discharged. Thereafter persons leaving the centers either for emergency hospitalization or Army examination or induction should be issued short-term passes. The status of those who reported to the Army should be converted to indefinite departure once they have entered on active duty.

The provision regarding readmission of hospitalized evacuees, however, does

Designed to meet the needs of large families, the hostel apartment known as "Apartment 29," is conveniently located in midtown Manhattan, and is intended to simplify relocation for Issei and their children. It is suitable for a family group of any combination of ages, or for two small families, and will be available to families for periods up to two weeks. School-age children can be admitted to a public school one block from the apartment immediately following their arrival and can be transferred later to the school in the neighborhood where the family establishes its permanent residence, Steiding said.

The furnished quarters consist of a dining room, a kitchen, two bedrooms, and a private bathroom.
