## RED CROSS DRIVE YIELDS \$1939.45

Tabulations from all but three blocks showed that thus far the 1945 Red Cross Drive among the Rohwer evacuees has raised \$1939.45.

The Drive which lasted from March 12 to 17 was conducted within individual blocks by two representatives and the block managers.

Amount of contributions from each block was: Blk. 1, \$56.25; 2, \$59.50; 3, \$66.50; 4, \$62.75; 5, \$75.50; 6, \$69.75; 7, \$63.50; 8, \$62.25; 9, \$52.50; 10, \$56.50; 11, \$63.50; 12, \$71.35; 13, \$67.14; 14, \$80.25; 15, \$72.50; 16, \$69; 17, \$55.50; 19, \$66.50; 20, \$53; 23, \$56.25; 24, \$66; 26, \$61.40; 27, \$76; 28, \$63.50; 29, \$69.75; 32, \$79.25; 33, \$68.15; 39, \$78.35; 40, \$76.50; 41, \$75.20.

Blocks 25, 34, and 38 had not at last report, yet indicated their results.

## Appeal Board Arrives Sunday

An Army appeal board arrived at the Center Sunday to hear some of the cases of those who had appealed their exclusion orders.

The board is headed by Col. O. I. Holman. Other members are Col. Harry E. Sandusky and Lt. Colonels Ivan W. Meyers, Ray K. Terry and Lyle E. Cook. The officers are accompanied by three enlisted men, one of whom is a court reporter, another is a stenographer and the other typist. Only a few cases will be heard this week, and the board will return to California by plane Friday or Saturday.

At some later date they, or a similar group, will return to the center to hear additional appeals. Those whose appeals are to be heard will be notified at least ten days in advance and will be requested to fill out a questionnaire.

## Certificate Of Birth Needed

"Nisei leaving the Center should bring birth certificates with them if they possible can," stated Prudence Ross, acting relocation supervisor of the Chicago Area.

Miss Ross pointed out that many of the best jobs are in war plants and that persons cannot be hired for this work without definite evidence of date and place of birth. Ordinarily only a birth certificate meets this requirement, since WRA identification cards are no longer issued now.

Identification papers which an alien is required to carry with him are usually sufficient for Issis.

## Bill Kills Job Discrimination

New York became the first state in the Union to set up a special, permanent State commission charged with the specific task of eliminating discrimination in employment because of race, creed, color, or national origin when Governor Thomas E. Dewey signed the Ives-Quinn Bill on March 12 in the State Capitol at Albany, N. Y.

The nation's first anti-discrimination law, which becomes effective July 1, sets up a commission of five members. The bill directs them to eliminate discrimination in employment by conciliation, persuasion, and mediation where possible, but it authorizes the commission to issue orders, subject

# CURTISS CANDY CO. FARM WANTS FIFTEEN

There are openings for fifteen farm workers (single men) immediately at the Curtiss Candy Company Farm No. 63 at Marengo, Illinois.

The Curtiss Farm Organization operates 11,000 acres of farm land in northwestern area of Illinois. The organization maintains sixty-two farms and engages in dairying, poultry, beef cattle, hog, truck gardening and general farming.

The Marengo Farm is located 72 miles from Chicago and 23 miles from the town of Hookford. Marengo is three and a half miles from this farm. Community acceptance is excellent in this area and workers have been well received since the inception of the Truck Gardening Project.

Wages paid for single men is \$100 a month with board and room. Bonuses have been paid to workers during the past two years based on the crop yield. Workers become eligible for bonus after six months of service.

Workers live in a large dormitory which was constructed two and a half years ago. It is completely equipped and furnished with modern facilities. Hardwood floors, showers, laundry facilities and an oil furnace are installed in the dormitory. There is a spacious living room for use by the workers and an attractive dining room has been constructed.

The company will employ a Japanese cook to prepare food in the Japanese style.

This offer is not seasonal work but is permanent with the work all year around.

There are ten Japanese workers living on this farm for the past two years. These workers have worked on the Truck Project growing potatoes, soya beans, popcorn, and other garden products. A large farm program has been planned for this season.

Workers average 9 hours of work a day with six days of work in a week. During the harvest season

# MUCK FARM EMPLOYMENT

Employment for three single men and one family in which the wife would serve as cook is offered on a 300-acre muck farm at Davison, Michigan.

The family will have a living room, bed room, and a kitchen which is used as the dining room for eight working men. This house is provided free of charge.

The men would work on the farm. The wife who serves as cook would be paid \$4 a day and bonus if she works the whole season. The three single men and the head of the family mentioned above will receive 60 cents an hour for a ten hour day. They may also work on the seventh day if they choose.

These men will be paid a bonus if they work the full season or more. The season lasts from approximately April 1 to November 15. The employer wants particularly people who plan to stay more than one year. They will be provided housing rent free during the non-working time.

Shoji Tabuchi, Winter '45 graduate of Rohwer High School and former Blk. 9 resident recently returned to Stockton where he was met by Miss Elizabeth Humbarger and WRA officer from Robinson. Tabuchi went directly from Cincinnati where he had intended to enter the university. While a guest of Miss

Humbarger's home, Tabuchi writes of having dinner with three Nisei soldiers stationed at Tracy at her invitation. Prior to and since evacuation she did much for those of Japanese ancestry and her friendship has meant much to them. Before Tabuchi's arrival Miss Humbarger met with College of Pacific heads to discuss problems of student relocation. At every available opportunity she has presented and explained the Nisei problem to the public.

# S. CALIFORNIA DOMESTIC JOBS

Names and applications of all evacuees interested in obtaining domestic employment in homes of military personnel have been requested by Major Prentiss Moore, Personal Affairs Officer, Western Flying Training Command, 110 West 8th Street, Santa Ana, Calif.

The offer includes employment of couples, with board and room furnished, and with wages customarily paid in that area. This employment is in Orange, Fullerton, and Anaheim.

## ONCE OVERS

After three years of living in the centers, the Issei still look upon the Nisei as young, immature, incapable upstarts. I'm speaking of the Issei in this center, as I do not know the situations in the other camps. But if I know my Issei and I do, they're probably of the same attitude as the Issei here.

Which is really too bad. Not for us Nisei, but for the Issei. It's too bad, because it indicates that they haven't progressed much in their thinking in the past three years.

It shows that the Issei are still thinking along the lines of the pre-evacuation days, when they ran the show and the Nisei were mere striplings just out of our swaddling clothes. Oh, there were some Nisei who managed to break thru the retaining barrier of the paternal autocracy and achieve a bit of success. But they were regarded as "accidents" or "freaks," who climbed the rung by luck or with Issei help.

According to the Issei way of thinking, the Nisei were just too young, too inexperienced, too incapable, too everything. They forgot that they were young on ce themselves. They forgot that they were also without experience themselves, till they got the chance to prove themselves.

In the main, tho, their biggest failing was in always regarding the Nisei as "too young." No matter if able Nisei reached the ripe age of 30, it was always the same. "Too young," they said.

Well, came the evacuation, and you should have heard some of them cry. Perhaps you did hear them. You remember the tune. Why didn't the Nisei do something to prevent it? Why didn't the Nisei stand up on our hind legs and demand that the military let us stay on the coast? Why didn't the Nisei do this, and that and that?

something akin to scorn by the Issei, now was looked to by these same Issei for leadership. And when the JACL, floundering around under weak leadership, did the best it could under the circumstances, it came in for much soothing criticism from the Issei. Much of it was justified, perhaps, but much more of it was not.

After being shipped to this center, some of the Issei who were leaders in the Japanese communities back on the West coast, were a trifle hungry for "power." But when they learned that only Nisei were eligible, under a WRA ruling, for elective offices, they let out a howl that was heard all the way in Washington.

And when Washington, partly to mollify them and partly because relocation was draining these centers of the Nisei leaders, revised its ruling to permit Issei to be elected councilmen, the Issei here quieted down, in much the same manner as a crying child when he is given a lollipop to suck.

Well, that followed after that is as plain as the mole on your uncle's nose. They did some good, of course. But they also found time to indulge in some peanut politics which have been a constant source of amusement to the rest of us.

And now that the time has come to consider relocation seriously in all its practical aspects, the Issei are still continuing to make the same old mistakes. They are proceeding about their business as if there were not Nisei

heard at all. If that sounds a bit harsh, then why weren't the local Nisei consulted about the proposals that were carried by the local representatives to the recent inter-center conference in Salt Lake City? The delegates were supposed to represent all the people in the center. But they didn't represent all of us any more than the Hearst Papers do the American people.

Local Issei Leaders should remember that there are still Nisei living in the Center. Local Issei leaders should remember, too, that the Issei will necessarily have to depend on the Nisei a great deal during the coming months in resettlement, readjustment, and rehabilitation.

Let some people mis-continue my statements, let me state plainly and I have no personal axes to grind. I speak for all the Nisei in the center. I'm running the risk of being called a fresh upstart" by some of the Issei. But I'm not worried. I've been called that before.

But I am worried about the Issei's inability or unwillingness to cast off their pre-Pearl Harbor type of thinking in favor of some plain, unadulterated, look-to-the-future type of common sense.
