Wounded in Italy on April 5 was Pvt. John S. Oki, formerly of Stockton, Calif., whose sister, Mrs. Kazuyo Ishimaru, lives at 24-11-D.

Pvt. Oki was wounded previously in France last fall and was later awarded the Purple Heart. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Junkichi Oki, are at Tulelake.

Also wounded in Italy on April 5 was Pfc. Misao Sakauye, also for the second time, according to a War Department notification received by his mother, Mrs. Haru Sakauye, 12-1-D, this week.

The former San Pedro (Calif.) fisherman was seriously wounded in France last October. He is starting on his fifth year of army service.

# ONCE OVERS

At Mansaray, 3000 evacuees attend memorial service for Franklin Delano Roosevelt, with clergymen of three faiths--Buddhist, Protestant, Catholic--officialiating. Which causes me to ask: Why didn't we have a service here? One of the Christian ministers was asked that, and he assertedly replied: "That's not our responsibility." A fine statement for a spiritual leader to make. If it's not the church's responsibility to call such a service, whose responsibility is it? Seems to me the local ministers were asleep at the switch on that one.

Tokyo Rose, who broadcasts nightly over Radio Tokyo, is Miss Shio Sakamishi, who was returned to Japan by the government immediately after Pearl Harbor. She is a graduate of the University of Michigan and up until seven years before the attack, was chief assistant of the Oriental division of the Library of Congress. She is not a Nisei.

Dr. Masako Kusayanagi, physician on leave from Los Angeles General hospital, was denied a request for immediate reinstatement by the County Board of Supervisors. That august body stated that she had been granted leave "for the duration of the war." It's my guess that the County Civil Service Commission will reverse the decision and reinstate the Nisei doctor.

Kent Shoemaker, former county clerk in Oregon, has sponsored another full-page advertisement in a Hood River newspaper. In this one, which is his sixth full-pager, he warns the "Japs" to keep out of Hood River and belittles contribution of Nisei soldiers. Lower part of page

## WRA TO GIVE SHIPPING AID

In order to provide eligible evacuees still at the centers with the same types of property transportation assistance as those who relocated prior to revocation of the exclusion orders, the WRA will pack, crate, and move household and personal effects from the place of private storage within the nearest evacuated area to the common carrier depot to the point of relocation, said Evacuee Property Officer, E. F. Owon. The only expense to the evacuee is the drayage or hauling charge from the depot at the point of relocation to his residence.

## TO AID WITH INVENTORY

In order to get property in shape for the closing of the center, four men are here assisting in the compiling of property records and taking of a project-wide inventory. J. D. Williams, from the Washington Supply Office, Robert A. Smith from Granada, Jim Squiros from the San Francisco office and Marion Byrd from Minidoka will be here in the center for about two months, or until the work is completed.

Also working on this inventory will be P. O. Morgan, cost accountant, Charles Leek, assistant fiscal accountant, and others in the financial section, said Charles D. Updegraff, supply officer.

(continued from page 2) contains names of Hood River residents endorsing two statements: (1) 100% behind Hood River Logion post in efforts to keep Japanese from returning, and (2) favoring "every lawful means to keep them out." Quite a patriot, is he? **Shoemaker.**

The Oregon Property Owners' Protective League, which recently demanded the resignation of WRA Chief Dillon Yor and Harold S. Fistero, Northwest area WRA supervisor, has shed its sheep's clothing and changed its name to the Japanese Exclusion League. Guess the directors of the race-baiting body decided that they weren't fooling

anybody.

War Manpower Commission's Chairman Paul V. McNutt opined recently at Chattanooga (Tenn.) that all Japanese should be exterminated. Later, he explained that his statement represented his own opinion and was not a declaration of government policy. A few days later, Robert E. Sherwood, author, playwright, and former director of the overseas branch of OWL, stated in an address at Baltimore that he was opposed to total extermination of the Japanese.

An anti-Japanese meeting, sponsored in Seattle recently by the Remember

Kozo Hattori of Rohwer has purchased a 40-acre farm (an appent is a French land measurement of approximately .85 of an acre) in Louisiana, located on a main highway nine miles South of New Orleans.

Hattori also purchased the farming equipment, machinery, truck, mules, and the crops of bell peppers, squash, tomatoes, and corn already planted on fifteen acres.

Farm improvements include a modern six room house with city water and electricity, and other housing and farm buildings.

Mr. Hattori has returned here to complete arrangements with two other Japanese Americans who are to aid him in operating the farm.

Shortly after the closing of the Center's spring school term, Hattori and their three children and the families of the other two men plan to move to their new homes in Louisiana.
