**GIVE TENANTS 30 DAY NOTICE**

Although your lease terminates by its own terms, it is now necessary because of OPA regulations to give a thirty day notice of termination of the leasee (when the owner seeks to repossess for himself), otherwise the tenant cannot be evicted.

Where agricultural lands have been leased with housing accommodations, OPA has no jurisdiction, but a notice to quit or demand for possession should be made even though the lease contains a definite termination date; otherwise the tenant may hold-over for sixty days and thus acquire a right to keep the premises another year according to Section 1161, California Code of Civil Procedure.

Notices of termination of tenancy must be delivered to the tenant personally, and if the lease is with more than one tenant, a similar notice must be delivered personally to each

**ONCE OVERS**

Recently, a newspaper in a town called Minden, South Dakota, editorially commented thusly: "A squib in a paper makes the statement that there are some good Japanese Americans in this country, but it didn't say where they were buried."

This was read by a hometown boy in a far-off country, where he had gone to fight his country's battle, and it stung him to the quick.

So this hometown boy, Lt. Col. James M. Hanley, who is executive officer of the fighting 442nd combat team, sat down and whipped out an eye-opening letter to the editor of his hometown newspaper.

Last week his wife, now living in Seattle, made the contents of his letter public. Lt. Col. Hanley wrote:

"I know where there are some GOOD Japanese Americans - there are some 5000 of them in this unit. They are American Soldiers - and I know where some of them are buried."

"I remember one Japanese American. He was walking ahead of me in a forest in France. A German shell took the right side of his face off."

"I recall another boy. An '88 had been trying to get us for some time - finally got him. When they carried him out on a stretcher, the bloody meat from the middle of his thighs hung down. The bone parts were gone."

"I recall a Japanese American sergeant who had hid back blown up in two. What was he doing? Why, he was only lying on top of a white officer who had been wounded to protect him from shell fragments during a barrage."

"I recall one of my boys who stopped a German counter-attack single-handed. He fired all his BAR ammunition, picked up a German rifle and emptied it, then used a German luger pistol

"I wish I could tell you the number of Japanese Americans who have died in this unit alone. I wish I could tell you the number of wounded we have — the sightless eyes, the missing limbs, the broken minds."

"The marvel is that these boys fight at all. They are good soldiers in spite of racial prejudice shown by you paragraph. I know it makes a good joke, but it is the kind of joke that racial prejudice thrives upon."

"It shows a lack of faith in the American ideal. Our system is supposed to make good Americans out of anyone. And it certainly has in the case of these boys."
