URGE ISSEI REGISTER FOR ENGLISH CLASSES

On Monday, May 28 several teachers who have been teaching in the regular school program will begin classes for adults who do not speak English. These teachers are being asked to do this work be-

cause many residents of this center feel that they must learn some English before they can live in a community where English is spoken and where Japanese is not understood.

In these new classes, much help will be given in learning to speak English especially in making the difficult sounds. Attention will also be given to reading and writing.

If adults who want to learn English fail to enroll in these new classes, they will probably not have another opportunity to receive such instruction.

No community outside is likely to provide classes where only those adults who speak Japanese may meet together and learn English.

Many residents who speak broken English want help in speaking English correctly. They want to speak English so well that it will be acceptable outside this center.

Each block manager has registration blanks which are to be filled out within the week so that definite arrangements may be made for the new classes.

There is something soul-satisfying about getting up early on Sunday morning.

HOUSING FOR EVACUEE WAR WORKERS

Buffalo, N.Y. - Evacuees employed in essential industries are eligible and can obtain housing in government projects in suburban Buffalo, it was revealed.

Government housing authorities met with the representatives from the Buffalo Resettlement Committee and the relocation officer recently to discuss the problem of securing proper housing for evacuees.

Quarters are available for small family groups now. "Have your relocation program officer write early and we will see that your request gets quick attention," said George Graff, relocation officer.

Two evacuee families are already living in one of the projects, and their experiences have been very favorable. They have won their way into the community, and their friendliness and co-operativeness were soon recognized and they're among the most popular people in the community, said the project housing manager.

The residents of my block are said to be seriously considering presenting me with a scroll of honor, which will read something like this:
