AVAILABILITY OF CAR 7 MORE BERTHS AVAILABLE WILL DETERMINE DATES HEREAFTER

Due to the conversion of the way from the Atlantic to the Pacific, the procedure for requesting special cars will be different from the procedure now being used.

Up to the present time, the Relocation Division has been able to request a special car to be delivered on a certain date. They have been able to set these dates anywhere from three weeks to a month in advance.

However, in the future, a much shorter notice will be given. The reason for this is that the railroad company will advise the Relocation Division as to the availability of equipment.

One hundred and forty-five persons have signed up to go to California on May 30 and 31. The May 30 coach will consist principally of families who have members riding in the pullman, which is planned to operate in conjunction with the special car.

New Discussion

After several successful and resourceful meetings on Economic and Social Opportunities in America, a new series of panel discussions are being planned with the co-operation of the Adult Education and the Resettlement Commission with changes in subject matter and the locale.

"Resources and Problems in Relation to Housing" will be the subject for discussion for the next meeting, with Lloyd Shingu as chairman.

The panel of experts will include Vilma Van Duseldorp, C. B. Price, Corinne Key, Howard Nather, and also Melbourne Kataoka, who will act as interpreter.

The meeting will be held in Mess hall 28 on Monday, May 21, at 8 p.m. The discussion will be conducted both in English and Japanese.

It is hoped that other residents will take advantage of the opportunity afforded them in gaining helpful information from these discussions.

First priority of persons going on May 30 will be given to families who have one or more members in the pullman.

Second priority will be given to friends or relatives of those who have received first priority resulting from family members in the coach. There are seven more berths available on the May 30 pullman.

All persons eligible for pullmen or those willing to pay the difference in fare should make their wishes known at the Relocation Office at once. It is important that all pullmen arrangements be completed immediately, stated Robert A. Allison, assistant relocation program officer.

FRESNO EMERGENCY HOSTEL

The Fresno Japanese facilities, only bunks, mattresses, and blankets (no sheets) will be furnished, and these will be arranged on dormitory basis. A shower has been installed. Other information follows:

1. Lodgers please bring their own sheets, towels, and personal effects with them.

2. No meals will be served. No kitchen facilities are available. Restaurants are located nearby.

3. No smoking in the building.

4. Lodgers are urged to make their stay as short as possible to give place for others desiring lodging. Limit, two weeks.

5. Lodgers will be charged 25 cents per night to cover expenses.

6. Those desiring lodging should apply, Rev. Hideo Hashimoto, 1228 Kern Street, Fresno 1, California, in advance and receive confirmation. They should notify him of the time and date of arrival and the mode of travel.

7. The pastor will be available for consultation at the church office.

8. The phone number of the parsonage is Fresno 4-4135.

9. Those coming on the special trains from Rohwer should request the WRA at Sacramento to notify Rev. H. Hashimoto the time of arrival.

This new procedure is not to affect the movements on May 30 and 31.

exceptions. And even those are not what could be safely termed "sure cures."
