TANAKA PROMOTED ON BATTLEFIELD

News of the promotion of Lieutenant with the famous part of the renowned 442nd

T-Sgt. Bert M. Tanaka to a 100th Infantry battalion, infantry division, has been received by the New England WRA office in Boston, Massachusetts.

REGISTER ALL CARS, TRUCKS IMMEDIATELY

WRA regulations provide that evacuees shall not have custody or use of motor vehicles at relocation centers, except as specifically authorized in individual cases as an aid in removing the family or personal belongings of the owner.

Tanaka is the younger brother of Dr. Roy Tanaka of the local hospital staff, and has a wife and a one year old son in Cambridge, Massachusetts.

In accordance with these regulations, all evacuees' cars or trucks now in the center must be registered with the Internal Security Section on Thursday, May 26, and, if circumstances justify, authorization will be issued for their retention in the center a reasonable time.

Born in Hawaii, he came to the United States when he was 16, and returned in 1941 to join the Hawaiian National Guard and was stationed there with his unit during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor.

In the future, all incoming evacuee motor vehicles will be registered upon arrival at the gate.

He later went to Camp Shelby, Mississippi, and overseas to the European theater of war including the North African invasion.

Tanaka wears the Purple Heart, and the Silver Star and Presidential Unit Citation for his heroic exploits in the Italian campaign.

When the evacuation came I decided to take Betsy Ann with me to the Santa Anita Assembly Center. She could have stayed. But I needed her. I would have been lost without her. In those first bewildering, uncertain months, living in the stables behind barber-wire fences, it was Betsy Ann who helped to keep me on an even keel. Like the others, I was restless, puzzled, embittered, my faith in democracy shaken. For hours I would sit and pour out my thoughts to her. Betsy Ann listened, transcribed them, and never said a word. She understood. She helped me write letters to the Caucasian friends I had left behind, letters that generally expressed the various shades of resentment, bewilderment, and restlessness that I felt. And back would come answers from those stanch friends, not pitying my circumstances, not scolding my despairing thoughts, but encouraging me, cheering me, lifting me up from the depths of despair, and keeping alive that spark of faith in my country and my fellow man.

Such correspondence was like a tonic to my soul and heart; and it was Betsy (Continued on page 4)

PULLMAN RUMOR

The Relocation Division received word yesterday that the Southern Pacific Railway Company had agreed to pull the special Pullman scheduled to leave on May 30, from Sacramento to Los Angeles, according to R. A. Allison, assistant relocation program officer.

It has been rumored that persons with contagious diseases are traveling on this pullman. To date, there are no such cases signed up, and if there are, they will be put in private rooms in accordance with railroad and public health requirements.

No person with a contagious disease would be put in an open pullman, said Allison.

WRA Sets Closing Date For School

Closing dates for center schools have been set at all projects, National Director D. S. Myer, announced this week. Elementary and secondary schools at eight centers will end their final terms in the following order: Minidoka (elementary), May 18; Rohwer, May 25; Central Utah, June 1; Manzanar, June 2; Minidoka (secondary), June 1; Granada, June 5; Poston, June 4 and 5; Gila, June 8.

When family plans require a child to leave a center school before the official closing date, full credit will be given the pupil if his work has been above average, and if requirements are satisfactorily met.

Vocational training and adult post high school education will be reorganized into short courses. Only classes which contribute to relocation adjustment or accepted project needs will be retained.

The program will be chairmanned by Shizuko Tanaka with Mitsuye Nishimura in charge of the second part of the evening.
