JAPANESE MOVIE TO BE SHOWN

Three 34 mm. Japanese sound films will be shown free at the auditorium next Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. The films, furnished by the WRA through the Community Activities section, will be shown by the Co-op as a service to the community.

For the convenience of the audience, tickets will be distributed through the blocks. The films have been shown already in Tule Lake, Topaz, and Minidoka, and will be shipped June 15 from Minidoka to Rohwer.

WASHINGTON ANNOUNCES NO MORE ERC FOR NISEI

Washington, D. C. - Japanese Americans who are inducted into the armed forces of the United States, and those alien Japanese who volunteer for military service through their local Selective Service boards will no longer be transferred into the Enlisted Reserve Corps, according to an order issued by the Adjutant General's Office here. The new order became effective June 1.

Eight local boys, who left for induction on June 8, have since been activated into the U.S. armed forces.

They are: Mo-shitaka Hara, Fred Masaru Mayeda, Bill Masayuki Kinoshita, Hiroshi Kikawa, George Tanimoto, Norimasa Jack Kimoto, Jack Acao Kitahata and Yuichi Okumura (transfer).

Hereafter such registrants will be inducted and forwarded to reception centers for processing and assignment in accordance with current instructions for other registrants.

At the same time, those who were placed in the Enlisted Reserve Corps prior to June 1, will be called to active service not later than June 30.

ELIGIBILITY RULES FOR GRANTS

WRA has set up definite rules for deciding whether or not residents are eligible for the Resettlement Assistance grants. These requirements must be observed by Welfare Counselors and Relocation Advisers when they consider applications for help.

SURVEY TO BE CONDUCTED

Next week the Resettlement Planning Commission will conduct a survey in the line of housing problems and new regulations of Resettlement Aid Fund. The commission intends to circulate forms through the block managers and asks the co-operation of all.

DISCUSSION TO BE HELD

All center residents are invited to attend the panel discussion sponsored by Adult Education Dept. and Resettlement Planning Commission held in the west wing of the auditorium on Monday, June 18th at 8 p.m.

The topic will be "Housing Problems." All are urged to participate in the discussions.

First, the amount of cash which the family has (including that of relocated family members) shall be deducted from the amount of the grant.

- Cash resources include:
1. Currency on hand.
 2. Funds in any type of checking or savings account in either a bank, savings and loan association, or U.S. Postal Savings account.
 3. Income expected from property, other investments or farm resources.
 4. Market value of any war bonds, or other readily convertible securities or evidences of indebtedness.
 5. Income expected from WRA cash advances and allowances or public assistance grants.
 6. Value of major items of personal property not known to be essential in earning a living outside. This might include jewelry, automobiles for personal use, and other luxury items.
 7. Ownership of or equities in real property upon which a loan could be readily secured.

Next Tuesday's paper will explain the amount of help to be granted to those eligible.

ROHWER PERSONALITY: TAI KAJIMOTO, EVACUEE FIRE CHIEF

What makes fire a man select fire-fighting as a career? Usually it's supposed to be love of excitement, of the smell of smoke, or a desire to see the people scatter as you get the siren going and turn corners on two wheels.

But in the case of Tai Kajimoto, Rohwer's oldest fireman (in point of service not of age, he has to say), it was the fact that his pals were in the Fire Department, so he joined them way back in December, 1942 when Chief Hays Miller was training the crews.

Since that time the department has seen many changes in personnel—204 to be exact, including three different Fire Chiefs.

But Tai Kajimoto has remained to see the Rohwer Fire Department lead all the Centers in its record for fire prevention. It is even thought that our record is the best of any of the Government agencies.

He can tell you how small forest fires used to be a daily occurrence back in the early lumberjacking days. He takes time off from his hobby of writing to reminisce about the big fire in Block 16—which really wasn't much of a blaze but, then, with our efficient fire prevention program we just don't have big fires here.

When you ask this very quiet, young Evacuee Fire Chief how he explains the excellent record of his group, he gives credit to the excellent training and guidance of our Personnel Fire Chief's beginning with Hays Miller, continuing with Don Jones and coming up to the present with John F. Mallos. Then he thinks that the residents have given unusually fine cooperation in abiding by fire regulations, and last (as you would expect from such a modest young man) he mentions the department and its inspection program.

At present there are 44 men in the department, divided into three crews under three Asst. Chiefs; (continued on page)

WOUNDED GI VISITS ROHWER

Pvt. Roy Shimazu, injured across his right eye, is spending part of his 60-day furlough here with his family, after being wounded while fighting with the 442nd Combat Team in France and Italy. Veteran of two campaigns, he wears the Purple Heart, overseas ribbon with a campaign star, and the good conduct pin.

He has two brothers in the Army, Tom, in Italy, and Ben, former Rohwer High student, now stationed in Livingston, Louisiana.

Pvt. Shimazu is originally from Long Beach, California, evacuation placed him in the Santa Anita Assembly Center, thence to Denison and finally to Rohwer, from where he was inducted in the fall of 1944.

Early in 1945 found him overseas with the 442nd.

His parents and sister reside at 14-6-F.
