## EVACUEES TO REGISTER

### Centerwide WRA Sign-up To Speed Relocation Program

A general registration at relocation centers of all evacuees who are 17 years or over will start next week, E. M. Rowalt, acting director of WRA, announced today.

At the same time the War department announced that teams of Army representatives left Washington yesterday for the Rohwer and other WRA centers to obtain questionnaires from all male American citizens of Japanese ancestry who are 17 years and over.

The War department's action follows the announcement Thursday by Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson that a combat unit of American citizens of Japanese ancestry

All Nisei in this Center who desire to volunteer for service in the combat unit will have an opportunity to do so while the Army representatives are here. Work opportunities of a limited nature, chiefly domestic work, are plentiful in the Midwest, a survey of offers in the Employment files revealed this week.

Offers are as follows: Memphis, Tenn. "Healthy, young, optimistic girl" to cook and keep house.

Powers, Mich. 6 domestic workers to work in a public tuberculosis sanitarium. \$40 a month plus room, board and laundry; 2 weeks' vacation a year with pay. Also 3 graduate nurses at \$80 a month plus room, board and laundry with 2 weeks' vacation. Must be citizens.

Cedar Falls, Iowa. Woman, girl or young man to do housework for \$10 a week.

Highland Park, Ill. Experienced American-born, Christian girl to do domestic work for \$15 a week.

Indian Hill Village, Ohio. A couple for domestic labor for \$85 a month.

St. Paul, Minn. Girl to do general housework at \$50 a month. Japanese girls working in vicinity.

regulations.

"Children under 16 years of age and without support are eligible for grants. Eligibility shall not exist for employable persons who refuse employment.

"All applicants must be in need of assistance as grants will be based upon a follow-up of individual cases. Eligibility for

these grants shall exist only upon application. Those cases which are continued will be followed up each month, but no further applications will be necessary. "Applications for each monthly period must be in not later than the 25th of each month. Applications submitted after this date will be applicable to the following month."

Mr. Rowalt explained that through this general registration the WRA expects to get clearance on a large number of employable persons before they apply for leave and thus be able to speed up the relocation program.

"We are not trying to force any person to relocate who does not desire to do so," Mr. Rowalt said. "But there are increasing opportunities for evacuees to get jobs and if we can get a backlog of registrations on which we can be

working, we should be able to get clearance for indefinite leave for many people who later will want to relocate."

Final plans for registration at Rohwer have been completed by the Army team and Project director Ray D. Johnston.

## EDITORIAL JUVENILE DELINQUENCY

Tule Lake's relocation project, seems already to have encountered incidents that indicate the dangers of delinquency among its youth. Among other things smoking, gambling and class "cutting" have become commonplace and have resulted in the apprehension of several juveniles.

One-time sociology instructor at the College of the Pacific, and well-known friend of Stocktonians in this Center, Harold Jacoby of the Internal Security stated: "A delinquent has a mental attitude and does not worry about intentions.

"The child who is unable to gain recognition by good scholastic work will find some other way of gaining attention.

"Give people more things to do instead of entertaining them. If you do things for people, they lose the power to do it themselves.

"Despite the opinions of some people, law breakers should not be exhibited before the community as an example."

Further information from the Tulean Dispatch's magazine section reveals that the IS department is not able to cope with the situation since "it is not their job to strong-arm kids and punish them. It is the problem of trained sociologists and social workers to diagnose and rehabilitate delinquents."

Suggestions regarding means of alleviating the conditions ranged from the setting up of a "Boy's Town" to broader recreational accommodations for the youth. Tule Lake feels that the erection of its proposed auditorium will pave the way for partial solution.

Since Tule Lake and Manzanar were the first of the relocation centers to open its barracks for settlement, the experiences and troubles encountered in these two centers may well be a prelude to what may happen here.

In this Center, it is hoped that the harmonious relations established will not suffer a letdown, leading to disastrous outcomes.
