EUROPEAN REFUGEES

The W. R. A. has established the Emergency Refugee Shelter at Oswego, N. Y., where refugees from fourteen countries are now quartered. From Russia to Spain; Turkey to N. Africa, they have come. At the Y. P. C. F. tonight, we will hear Miss Bruriah Szapira, who was born in Poland, tell us of her experiences working in the refugee camp. "There's hardly a complete family unit and many have been wandering for about six years," she commented. Miss Szapira speaks German, Hebrew, Polish, Russian, and Ukrainian languages and has worked for the Family Society in Philadelphia and the National Council of Jewish Women in New York City.
