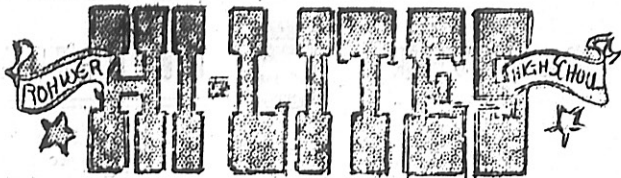

The Hi-Lites will be circulated weekly beginning Friday, March 23, 1945. A weekly paper can be of more value to the students, the staff believes.

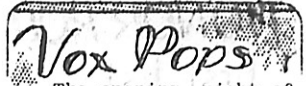

# PEPSI COLA OFFERS SCHOLARSHIP

A nation-wide scholarship contest conducted by the National Administrative Board of educators and financed by the Pepsi-Cola Co. has been offered to all High School Seniors in the U. S. regardless of race, creed, or color. The six elected by the 12A's to take this test in Rohwer are; Ruth Hirose, Tomio Muranaka, Terrie Otsubo, Yoshikazu Sakakura, George Takahashi, and Yuri Yaguchi. Honorable Mention; Yutaka Shiraiishi, Jane Asawa, and Yasuko Honda.

**Nature of Scholarships:**  
Four years of study in any college selected by the student; full tuition and required fees; \$25 a month for the normal 36 months of college attendance; railroad fare at 3/4 mile to and from college once every year. No obligations incurred.

**Number of Scholarships:**  
Total of 118 (2 in each state).

**Requirements for participation:** Any High School Senior who has good grades and is elected by his classmates as being among the 5% in his class, most likely to succeed. The students elected will then take in their own schools on April 16, 1945 a special scholastic aptitude test prepared by the College Entrance Examination Board. The final winners for each state will be selected on the basis of this test.

### I'M CONFESSING

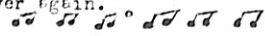
WEADDA LIFE!

Over again.

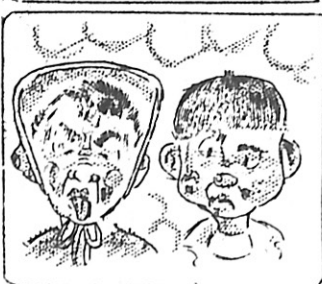
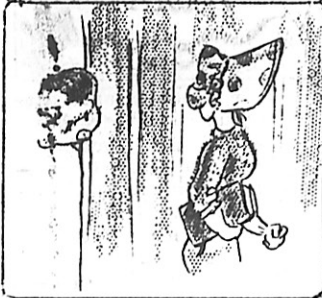
