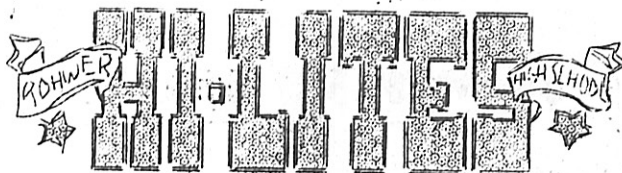
Prizes are: 1st - \$400, 2nd - \$100, 3rd - 50.

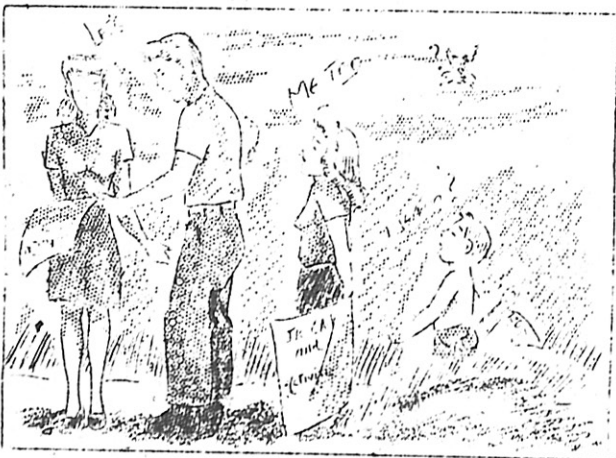

What does the above paragraph have to do with Spring? Quien sabe? (Who knows?) It must be Spring!



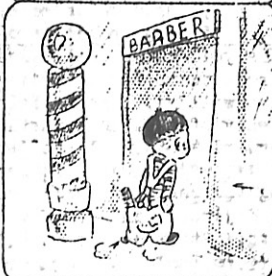

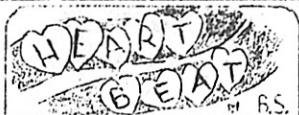
