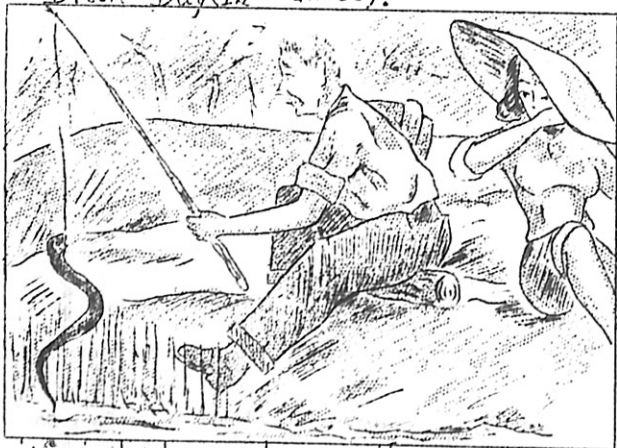
## editorial
