

# N.H.S. Installation



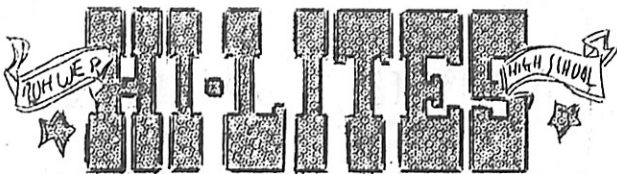

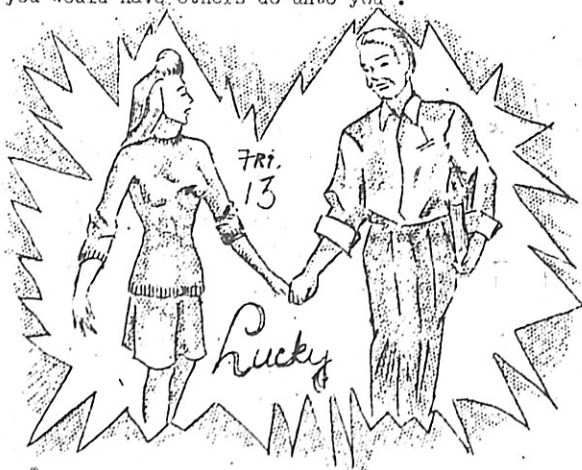

## OUT OF THE MAIL BAG

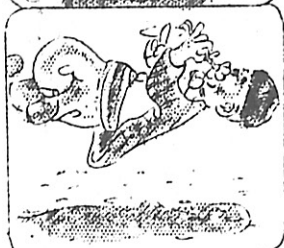

# VETERAN VISITS R.H.S.

Amiable Lt. K. Kanazawa (uncle of Mary Tanaka, 11A-5) on a convalescent leave from Billings Gen. Hospital in Indiana, caused a sensation among the susceptible sex last week.

Lt. Kanazawa participated in three campaigns in Europe; the Anzio Beachhead, Rome, and Southern France and he wears a Presidential Citation, the Purple Heart and Cluster.

Several classes were fortunate enough to hear him speak briefly on the famous places in Europe he had seen--- including Rome, Naples, etc.

Before his induction in December 1941, Lt. Kanazawa attended the University of Hawaii and was working with the Honolulu Police Force and the F.B.I.

When asked if he might have any message for the Student Body, he replied, "The meritorious performance in the past as well as at the present of Americans of Japanese extraction in both the European and Southwest Pacific Theaters has brought about a tremendous advancement toward a better understanding of us by Americans in general. However, we cannot rest on their laurels alone and simply hope that their accomplishments will be the magic solution that will wash away the misunderstanding and discrimination that we face."

Therefore, those of you about to enter the armed forces must carry on in the fine manner your predecessors have done and those of you who remain at home must continue to discharge your normal duties as citizens and live as worthy Americans. The road ahead of us is not an easy one but I'm confident that our sincere and earnest efforts will be a direct contribution toward building a richer and finer America."
