
FRIENDSHIP HOUR OBSERVED

In addition to the Center, he will spend some time on the West Coast, especially in Oregon and Washington, where he plans conferences with the state departments of Education in order to facilitate the transfer of students from Center schools to schools in those states.

ment of: Education.
