OF LIVING

The cost of living at present time in most of the cities of the middle west where a considerable number of residents are expected to relocate in private employment, is lower than in San Francisco, according to the latest figures made public by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, US Department of Labor.

A worker's income of \$150 a month in San Francisco in December, 1941, is taken as the base on which these figures were prepared. In order to buy the same quantities of goods and services, which this 1941-\$150 income bought in San Francisco, the worker now would require an income of \$167.54. This budget is for a family of four persons and takes into account food, clothing, rent, utilities, house furnishing and miscellaneous goods and services.

To maintain the same standard of living in February, 1943, in other selected cities, the following income would be required: Chicago \$163.41; Cincinnati \$151.75; Cleveland \$160.36; Detroit \$163.52; Indiana-polis \$146.77; Milwaukee \$157.23; Kansas City \$142.84; Minneapolis \$156.44; New Louis York \$168.28; St. \$156.19; Denver \$147.72.

POLICE AND FIREMEN

heedlessly burdened the work of these groups.

There have been cases of false alarm fires which have sent the firetrucks racing through the Center on needless trips. There have been times when private parties have been "crashed." There have been instances of potty theft and other infractions of police regulations.

Despite all this, the well-being of the community has been better assured by the alert and over-ready response of the police and fire departments to any emergency calls.

In consideration of their work, it remains for the other residents of the Rohwer center to be more considerate in their actions and careful in doing anything which may nullify their work.

This Conter's perfect record in orderly living must not be marred nor should the achievements of the two departments be forgotten by the Center.
