Evacuees who leave Rohwer to work in the sugar beet fields this year should be able to earn about 22 per cent more than in 1942 for the same amount of work, as a result of the Department of Agriculture's recent determination of minimum wage rates for the 1943 sugar beet crop.

These increases, Department of Agriculture officials said, make it possible for labor to share in the higher income from the beet crop expected this year.

Sugar workers are the only agricultural laborers who are protected by federal minimum wage guarantees. The Sugar act, passed by the United States Congress in 1937, requires the Secretary of Agriculture to set fair and reasonable wages for all sugar beet operations every year after public hearings and investigations.

Minimum wages for each district where most Rohwer residents planning to accept sugar beet employment will probably work are as follows:

South Dakota, southern and eastern Montana and northern Wyoming: blocking and thinning--55 cents an hour or \$13 per acre; first hoeing--50 cents an hour or \$3.50 per acre in South Dakota and \$4 per acre in southern and eastern Montana and northern Wyoming; harvesting--65 cents an hour.

Where evacuees enter into contracts calling for wages higher than the established minimum, government regulations provide that the contract scale shall be paid.

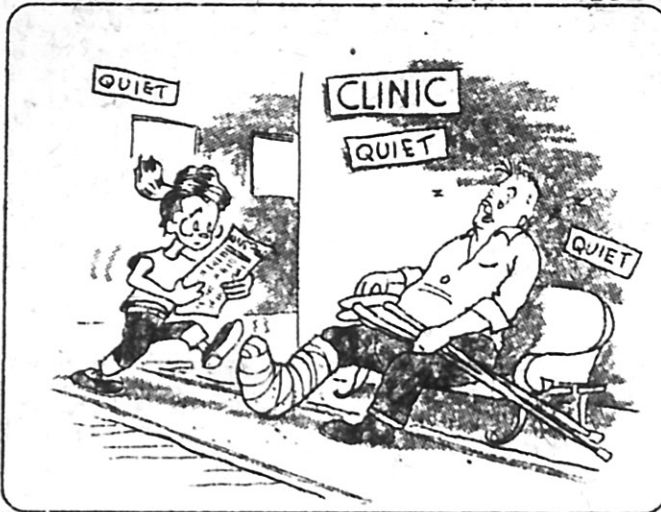

EDITORIAL

NATIONAL MUSIC WEEK

Music has charms that lend dignity even to the humblest surrounding is a statement that we in the Center have found to be true. Thus the coming of the 20th National and Inter-American Music week, keynoting the theme, "Foster American and World Unity through Music," finds its significance among us to a greater degree.

The Music week committee has issued as its objective the thoughts in the following passage:

"World Unity should be the aim of all enlightened leaders, seeking harmony and the establishment of permanent peace in a democratic world, ruled by free peoples. There is no arbitrary formula which can achieve this condition, human nature and the many conflicting individual and national interests being what they are.

"Our hope must be in the educational process and the increasing thought which all nations devote to the discovery and promotion of our common interests. These interests are many, and music is distinctly one of them. It breathes the harmony and cooperation, and is ideal for advancing that spirit.
