(Continued from page 1) strong poisonous nature of the powder, it should positively not be applied on leafy vegetables such as nappa, daikon, spinach, cabbage and other greens.

M. Takeuchi of the entomology division of agricultural department suggests that the insecticide not be used on the tomatoes, oucumbers, eggplants and beans after the fruits have formed.

Aphis may be controlled by using home-made tobacco juice mixed with a solution of soapy water.


