**DOCTORS OF JEROME HELP**

To relieve the acute doctor shortage in the hospital, Dr. Kazuo Miyamoto and Dr. Kikuo Taira of Jerome relocation center are temporarily aiding the medical staff for a week. Next week, two other "twin center" doctors will take their places for a similar period. They are Drs. Fred Fujikawa and Tom Abe.

The arrangement was made by the Rohwer block managers' group with the Jerome medical men in order to help the understaffed hospital here while a permanent system could be worked out.

At present Drs. Wilfred Gotanda and Junji Hasogawa are the only two local evacuee doctors available since Dr. Kensuko Uohida is now ill.

**LEAVE PLAN EASED**

**WRA Will Permit Leaves In Advance Of Job Offers**

Development of a new plan which will enable more evacuees to leave the Center on indefinite leave in advance of receiving definite job offers was reported today by E. B. Moulton, project leave officer.

Where a WRA relocation officer feels that he could place more people than are now coming into his area, he supplies the project leave officer with information about the number of workers needed, the types of jobs open, wages, housing, cost of living and other pertinent information about the community.

The Project Director is then authorized to issue indefinite leave to evacuees whose skills seem to fit the request made by the relocation officer. Upon arrival in the community, evacuees will be helped by relocation supervisors and the local officer of the US Employment Service to locate specific jobs.

Because a wider range of employment opportunities is ordinarily available through personal interviews on the spot, it is expected that any evacuee who leaves the Center under this plan will secure employment within a few days.

Leave is issued only if there is a definite possibility that the applicant will be employed quickly. Transportation and early living expenses are paid by the WRA on the same basis as the persons leaving to accept specific jobs.

**Fire Alarms**

Too many false fire alarms are being turned in, announced Lindsey Hatchett, fire chief.

Persons turning in these false alarms will be prosecuted under WRA rules and regulations.

If convicted, the penalty for this crime is 90 days or more in the Arkansas City Jail.

**PRICE GAINS NEW POSITION**

One of the most popular of the administration officials will be lost when C. B. Price, director of community activities, leaves the Center for St. Louis, Mo., tomorrow.

Price, who has a Masters degree with a major in group work and a minor in boys' work, will take over the duties of boys' work secretary in the downtown YMCA in St. Louis. Also at the Ohio State university he worked toward a Ph. D. degree in school and community relationships.

Coming to the War Relocation Authority early in October from the Arkansas Ordnance plant where he worked in the personnel department, he made use of his position as CA director to bring about better conditions in the Center.

Seventeen cablegrams and 300 letters have been sent to the Orient through the local Red Cross chapter, while 15 answers have been received to date, revealed chairman Sadazo Uematsu today. The cablegram deposit has been reduced to \$11.

Reports from the Red Cross meeting held last week disclosed that the local unit has obtained a number of furloughs for soldiers, cooperated with the block managers in putting up awnings for the hospital and instituted First Aid training in the junior high school by buying junior handbooks.

A letter has also been sent to the Red Cross headquarters in Washington, requesting action on the return of Dr. Norman Kobayashi to the Center. This was in conjunction with a similar request of the block managers to the WRA.

The departure of Dr. Masaki Yayoshi, chairman, for Colorado and the resignations of Fred Koyama and nurse Dorothy Kato from their positions resulted in a special election.

Uematsu was unanimously chosen the new chairman with the other chairmanships as follows: J. K. Fujimori, Fred Koyama, vice chairman; Yoshiko Shiroishi, secretary; Frank Mirikitani, treasurer; Giichi Suoyasu, auditor; Kats Nagai, first aid; Shizuka Eya, junior Red Cross; Fumiko Gohata, home nursing; and Uematsu, home service.

Disaster preparedness chairman is as yet unfilled.

# NISEI TALENT SHOW

To the Block 28 Diamond Heads belongs the credit for sponsoring the best talent show to date for the nisei in this Center. Star-studded, thrill-packed and surprise-filled, the Center Talent Review was an outstanding contribution toward providing a morale-raising impetus at a time when the relocation movement is divesting the community of many well-liked leaders.

From the varied talents of the 13-year-olds, the rocking rhythm of the Rohwer Follies, to the popular and classic songs of Richard Doi, Akemi Uyeoka and George Seno, the program was an interesting prelude which we hope will bring further shows of this type during the coming summer months.

# ARKANSAS TABOO

With the approach of warm weather, hiking and picnicking will meet the fancies of many residents. Week-ends will take sizable number out towards the wooded area for fishing and relaxation.

The call of Nature is a worthy one and provides wholesome recreation--relieving the close, discomforting tenseness of camp life and making possible the full enjoyment of God's gifts to Arkansas. But there is a necessity for caution.

Among the trackless fields around the Center, pigs, ducks and chickens often rove, seemingly without homes or owners. These animals must not be molested because they are not wild. They are merely foraging for food and belong to the farmers in the nearby farms. No one has bothered them to date, and no one must bother them in the future.

# THE HEARST PAPERS

Latest large-scale slandering of the West Coast Japanese-Americans comes through the papers under the control of William Randolph Hearst, who has been the leader in many past sensationalistic newswriting. He has always furthered racial animosity as a part of his belief in Americanism.

The credit for the current, world-wide conflict may well be placed partly on his shoulders while evacuation has largely been due to the "spy-scare" tactics of his papers.

Hearst papers carried a full-page editorial rebuking Ickes for hiring Japanese-Americans on his farm and used the medium of the Pacific League to ask him to return the nisei to the relocation centers so that they may be kept under close observation lest some Japanese treachery is revealed.

To read suspicion and to breed distrust are the products of a warped mind. If past records are to serve as the basis for belief in the present, the trust in the Japanese-Americans is better placed than upon such shoulders as William Randolph Hearst.
