

FLOOD: WATERS MAY REACH ROHWER

Presenting an entirely new angle to local readers, the Arkansas Gazette came out yesterday morning with the news that "Rohwer was believed to be most likely to be affected by flood waters, while Jerome was considered relatively safe."

Maj. Olav Rusvold, executive officer of the Fourth District, is now investigating the area occupied by Rohwer and Jerome.

The reason given is that in case of an emergency the two relocation centers may be removed from danger "with the least possible delay."

However, "There is nothing to fear about Rohwer being flooded," according to James R. Rhyno, Public Works head.

As for the local Red Cross chapter's disaster committee, headed by capable John Shimakawa, it was learned that it is yet in the stages of organization.

CO-OP ENTERPRISES FILES CORPORATION PAPERS

SCHOOL ENROLLMENT SHOWS 2200 STUDENTS

Enrollment of the entire Rohwer school system is now approximately 2200, out of which about 1150 are enrolled in the 2 elementary schools.

There are 7 evacuee nursery teachers at present under the supervision of Mrs. Josephine Lawrence; 24 evacuee elementary and 16 Caucasian instructors under Merrill Ziegler and C. G. Bolin; 9 evacuee secondary teachers, 27 evacuee assistant teachers and 29 Caucasian teachers under William Beasley, high school principal, and John Bledsoe, assistant high school principal.

The clerical staff of the school system consists of 1 timekeeper, 1 junior cost accountant, 2 assistant clerk stenographers, 1 assistant clerk, 10 junior clerk stenographers and 1 stock clerk.

The evacuee teachers work under a Caucasian teacher. Each makes the plans for some time ahead and turns them in to be checked. Some of the other things they do are correct papers, give tests and check them, keep the records of the students, give them assignments, conduct the classes daily besides attending extension courses of the University of Arkansas.

EDITORIALS

TO LEAVE OR NOT ?

With more than 50 evacuees leaving the Center each week to accept employment in middle west and Rocky Mountain states, the Center population has been decreasing steadily.

At present, however, there still are approximately 7900 living here. Of this total many have said that they have no desires whatsoever to relocate. A limited number have made up their minds and will be leaving in the near future. Others are undecided as to which step they should take.

The problem now is to help the undecided ones form a positive opinion and to make those with negative attitudes reconsider their feelings.

With the production capacity of the evacuees in great demand, jobs are plentiful. And as jobs are available, nisei should take them and do their utmost to aid in the war effort. At the same time, evacuee nisei will be convincing the American public of their loyalty. If the nisei wants to be accepted by the public, he must forget his experiences of the past year and leave this Center without any bitterness.

WISE RESETTLEMENT

That evacuees must not relocate themselves without chips on their shoulders was expressed by Harold S. Fistere, relocation supervisor in Cleveland, Ohio, in a letter to Project Director Ray D. Johnston.

"The last man you sent here was completely unsatisfactory," Fistere wrote. "As soon as he found that the foundry work involved dirt and occasional smoke, he rejected the offer and left for Chicago. We do not want any more men of his type referred to the Cleveland area. Such men give the entire group we are working with a bad name."

Therefore, when you relocate with the wrong attitude, you not only give the nisei a bad name, but you also hamper the work of the War Relocation Authority in the area to which you go. If your job, however, is under conditions contrary to those which were agreed upon before your acceptance, you have every right to reject the position. To accept employment under conditions unequal to those which other Americans work is unwise, because of the bitterness created when other employees learn that evacuee nisei are willing to work for less pay.
