The Denson branch of the US Post office, located across the street from the administration buildings (see map), is open to handle all customary postal business, according to Fred R. Paris, superintendent.



All formulas for infant feeding for the 24 hours will be prepared by the mothers with the block mothers! supervision at their designated kitchens, medical staff announced.

The mothers will assemble at 7 peme sharp to sterilise bottles and prepare the formulas which will be

"The Medical staff has discussed the infant feeding problem, and they concluded that this is the only plan which will work under the present conditions, Dr. Donnell W. Boardman, acting Chief medical officer, said.
