32. If I am wented not for military service but for civilian work, how long will it be before I granted indefinite leave under this program?

If your application is affirmed, as soon as you The War Relocation authority and the get a job. United States employment service are developing job opportunities as quickly as possible.

33. Will I be permitted to travel throughout the United

Yes, except that return to the evacuated area will not be permitted except on the authorization of the Western Defense Command. Permits for temporary visits will be granted automatically to Japanese American soldiers in uniform.

34. Will voluntary induction confer reinstatement privileges in employment held prior to evacuation? An opinion of appropriate legal authorities is now

being obtained to this question.

35. Is the Army program in substitution for War Relocation, authority's indefinite leave policy?

A. No. in addition. 36. Why is it intended not to use the combat team

against the Japanese?

For general security reasons. Obviously, it would be hazardous to the team itself and to the Army as a whole to use the team against the Japanese since the danger of the enemy getting within or behind our lines in American uniforms would be a constant risk, hazardous not only to the operation but to every Japanese American in the areas

37. Will Japanese American women be considered for en-

rollment in the WAACS?

Army Plan Supported

WASHINGTON, D.C. Feb. (Special) -- Strong editorial support of the War Department's decision to form a combat unit of loyal persons of Japanese ancestry for service in an active theatre of war is disclosed in a survey here of newspapers throughout the coun-

The Minneapolis Merning Tribume refers to the War Department's action "wisely undertaken," and observes that "For the loyal citizens in those (recamps, there location) should be freedom to participate in the war effort, either on the home front or in our armed forces."

Several other papers, it was observed, also made reference to the increasing opportunities ployment of evacues in private industry, particularly war industries, a solution for problems growing out of evacuation.

Among West Coast newspapers supporting the forthe Portland Oregonian regards it as "Bad news for Hirohito," while the San Francisco Chronicle said the decision "will gratify all who have felt that the only proper test in their (Japanese American's) case. is loyalty, not racial origin.


