Millions in U.S. Hear Broadcast  
Originating in "Ad" Building

Final construction of Camps Two and Three in Poston City will be completed by Sept. 1, according to Ellis Georgia, chief of the U.S. Engineers, in charge of the War Relocation Project here, in the CBS Broadcast, "Report to the Nation," heard over 150 radio stations last night. The program originated in Washington D.C. switched to a temporary studio set up in the Administration Building here for 15 minutes, and closed in San Francisco with a short address by Lt. Col. Karl R. Bendetsen.

Chet Huntley, announcer for the special events division of CBS, Los Angeles, acted as master of ceremonies here. A description of community living was given by the following Postonians:
