INDUSTRY DEPTS. PREPARE FOR VARIOUS FOOD MANUFACTURING UNITS

With the continued rationing of food products in the outside markets, the Industry Dept. now forging ahead with plans to manufacture the Center : need in need in subsistence nainly Japanese pro-ducts which are "difficult to obtain" from the outside source.

Under the new coordinating plan for the three units, the manufacturing of food products will be set with each unit pro-ducing their respective supply of Tofu and Moyashi. Miso and Shoyu will be manufactured by Unit 3 Industry Dept. and distributed to other two units.
