**Many New Merchandise Lines Added;
Branches Planned**

A number of small branch stores will be opened at strategic locations throughout the city, according to an announcement made today by Stanley Tsuchiya, in behalf of Poston Community Cooperative Stores.

"These stores are owned and operated by the colonists and all profits will be for the benefit of the community at large," he pointed out.

At all times the Community Stores will carry the following supplies:

Drugs of all kinds,

Dry goods, (a shipment is expected soon)

Men's sox, women's bobbie sox,

hats (expected this week)

Soaps (face soaps, laundry, bar soap and flake soap)

Flash lights and batteries.

Fly spray, sprayers, fly paper.

Stationery and stamps.

Foods, Milk (orders taken, sold daily) cookies, crackers,

candies, ice cream, soda water, canned juices (ample supply)

fresh orange juice, prunes,

vegetable. Orders for fresh

oranges from L.A. will be taken by Wednesday each week.

Daily newspapers, subscriptions taken.

Tobacco, cigarettes.

Ray Furuta, formerly of Huntington Beach High School and Santa Ana J.C., holds the high school high jump record of 6 ft. 1 inch. He pitched for the 1940 Orange County J.A.U. champions, and at the present time is manager of the O.C. All-Stars in the current Poston Baseball pennant race.

"Lefty" Nishijima, attended Santa Maria J.C. and was voted the most valuable baseball player on

the team at the end of the season. He is an excellent basketball player and at the present time is manager of the Delano Dodgers.

Yozo Kobayashi, is an all-around athlete from Riverside J. C. He was captain of the J.C. baseball teams, is a professional golfer, and, in 1931, traveled to Japan with the L.A. Nippons. He plays third base or shortstop. At the present, he is organizing both "A" and "B" league teams.
