With charcoal production next in line, the Industry Dept. today is forging ahead with great anticipation with "Made in Poston" trade mark in the progress of industrial program promoted by the department.

An experimental kiln is constructed southwest of Blk. 59 with 20 kilns to be constructed, each with 1 ton capacity and with a required time of 4 days for the process.

Kazuhiko Nakamoto, charcoal div. head, assisted by Harada and Ishihara, specialists in the project, are in charge of the production.

The dept. in the immediate future will add another commodity to their ever-growing list of "Made in Poston" with the production of artificial wedding bouquets, corsages of gardenias, roses and orchids which are under the supervision of Mrs. Chino, Blk. 43.

REPATRIATION PROCEDURE NOW HANDLED THROUGH WRA SPANISH EMBASSY DIRECTS JAPANESE INTERESTS

The operating responsibilities formerly handled by the W.C.C.A. in regards to repatriation have been transferred to the War Relocation Authority. This change became effective November 15, according to WRA Administrative Instruction No. 65 which explains in detail the repatriation and exchange of Japanese.

Negotiations with Japan regarding repatriation are handled by the U.S. State Dept.; which deals with the Swiss Gov't as the Protecting Power for United States interest in Japan, and with the Spanish Gov't as the Protecting Power for Japanese interests in the United States.

In accomplishing the exchange, Japanese repatriates are placed the exchange aboard vessel in New York and it proceeds to the exchange point (Lourenco Marques, Portuguese E. Africa) where it is met by a boat from Jabearing American pan repatriates. The Portuguese Gov't is respofor insuring nsible transfer of the t he Nationals of the 2 hostile powers at Lourenco Marcues.

The WRA is working in close cooperation with the State Dept. in matters concerning repatriation. All Project Directors are responsible for accomplishing or expediting all phases of repatriation in relocation centers.

Any person of Japanese ancestry may file application for repatriation. Such applicants may also send a letter to the Spanish Embassy at Washington, D.C., informing them asking to be repatriated. In general, persons requested by the Japanese Gov't thru

its Spenish representative and desiring to return have priority over those not named by the Japanese Govit, even tho they have filed a request for repatriation with WCCA, WRA or the State Dott.

Further information concerning repatriation may be had at your legal department or by corresponding with the Spanish Embassy in Washington, D. C.

The Employment Bureaus of Poston have been directed by Vernon R. Kennedy, head of Industrial Relations to issue notice of essignment slips to all workers.

These forms when completed will be in five copies to be forwarded to Timekeeping, Social Welfare, Employment, the department in which the individual works, and to the individual worker.

Persons working without referral cards are advised to appear for an interview at the Employment Office as soon as possible.

In case of promotion or release, it has been suggested that the respective department heads notify the employment office. Such cooperation will facilitate the filling of forms.
