"NEAR TO THE HEART OF GOD"

"Father, I trust my spirit in thy hands." Luke 23:46
 When I first read Socrates' "Apology" and his words of farewell just before his death, I was very much impressed by the fact that there was little difference between Christ and Socrates. The only difference was that Socrates was a Greek while Jesus was a Jew. Therefore, were Jesus born in Greece with her pantheistic, metaphysical and logical background he would have become a Socrates and vice-versa.

However, after considerable thinking it gradually dawned on me that there were some fundamental differences between Jesus and Socrates. Socrates was not sure of God or the hereafter. All he said in substance was that he had led a good life as a philosopher and a citizen of Athens. He had no regrets of his earthly life, still he could say that he would depart in peace. But, if perchance, the Spirit which had guided him throughout this life would lead him to a higher life after death, what more could anyone ask.

A noble thought! A variable life! But it is an achievement of a genius, and a wise counsel of a noble soul. But with Jesus, the whole atmosphere changes. Especially, when we come to his last word on the cross, we see clearly the man who knows the Heart of God, instead of one who searches after the final truth.

Socrates, as great as he was, after all was a man who had only reached the threshold of a partial truth. It was, however, the highest peak of the searched truth.

On the other hand, Jesus embodies the revealed Truth which is known only by the divine Son who lives near to the Heart of God. The words "Father, I trust my spirit in thy hands" breathe the atmosphere of a warm confidence of a trusting child. There is no strain no pretence. The truth is revealed most beautifully and simply in this act of complete trust in His final wisdom. It also tells us that Jesus is not passively submitting to a cruel fate, but expressing his confidence that his part of the job is done exactly as his Father wished, and now his Father is going to fulfill his whole plan.
