MISSING MAN LOCATED

The Poston Red Cross helped to locate the other day a Caucasian soldier stationed with the Poston Military Guard who was being anxiously sought for by his mother in Nebraska. The request, sent in to Scotts Bluff County Chapter in Nebraska was first forwarded to the Red Cross Field Director at Camp Young, Indio, who turned the matter over to the local office.

YOUR MESSAGES TO JAPAN.

The Inquiry and Message Service of the local Red Cross has taken down 1200 messages to date for Poston residents of the 3 camps.

Civilian messages and cables are forwarded to American Red Cross National Headquarters in Washington, D. C. from where they are sent on every available passage to the Japanese Red Cross, via International Red Cross in Geneva. The Red Cross setup enables personal communications between civilians in enemy countries with approval of the govts concerned. Inquiries concerning safety or location of civilians or naval personnel outside the continental U. S. are also handled.

At least two cablegrams per week have been coming in steadily from the Japanese Red Cross via Switzerland. Residents are encouraged to make use of this service, offered free of charge.

The 15th of December has been set as the deadline date for those who wish to have the Home Service of the Poston Red Cross send Xmas cards to Servicemen. Poston residents with friends or relatives in the U. S. Service are encouraged to immediately bring the latter's addresses to the Red Cross Office, if they have not already done so.

Answering the call of a Poston youth and his soldier-brother at Fort Riley, Kansas, the Red Cross stepped in to assist them to their voices for assistance.

The boys' father, a tubercular patient, was left behind in a California County Hospital. His care was completed with the W.R.A. to remove the patient to the X-rayatorium in L.A. he was taken to the L.A. County Hospital and placed in a heavy, basement ward where lights had to be used all day, topped by poor service. Immediate contact with the L.A. Chapter, A.H. by the Poston Red Cross was followed by an investigation of conditions and the subsequent transfer of the patient to an upstairs room for care. Comfortable and one in a room there was a fellow-isolator to talk to.
