POSTON'S BIGGEST EVENT
SCHEDULED IN UNIT TWO
WITH NEW YEAR FESTIVAL

Activities Begin
Today And To Continue
Until Sunday Night

Unit I had its County Fair, Unit III its Christmas Bazaar, but what is expected to be the biggest affair of Poston community history is the eventful three day activities of the Unit II New Year Festival which opens today at 2:00 p.m. The 210 block on the school campus will be the locale of the events which have been centralized with the exception for few of the Sport-O-Cade program.

The opening ceremonies will be held at the specially constructed Festival stage with Kenzo Yoshida, program chairman, presiding. At 1:30 p.m. the Boy Scouts will make a pilgrimage from Block 227 to the fairgrounds. The Scouts will be in charge of the flag-raising ceremonies.

Unveiling of the Festival symbol will be conducted by Dr. B. Okonogi, honorary chairman. Addresses will be given by three unit Council chairmen, John Maseno II, Franklyn Sugiyama I, Harvey Iwata III. Administrator

EDITORIAL...

"TO LIVE IS TO FIGHT"

As we reflect back on the year 1942, our thoughts whirl in a kaleidoscopic pattern. The early stages of that year found us involved in all the confusing, intricate and sudden aspects occasioned by the evacuation. The eastward trek, not unlike the "Okies" and the Jews in being banished from our homes, facing an uncertain future. And now leading cloistered lives behind wire fences of the "relocation centers", we are still struggling to life our heads out of the dismal, disillusioning quagmire of selfish public opinion.

Our democratic heritage and environment has stood us in good stead. And lending us more courage and faith in the American way of life are thousands upon thousands of citizens on the "outside" who have gone to bat in our behalf. Now we must score the runs to justify their faith and trust in us. Already 5200 Niseis are in the armed forces, another 9,000 assisted in the sugar beet harvests, and thousands more are contemplating plans for permanent resettlement in the normal channels of American life.

Now we are face to face with the New Year. No one in this God's green and sanguinary earth can foretell what the future holds in store for us.

"To live is to fight," said Dr. Crane. Every being that amounted to anything has had to fight. In order to carve out a victory, one must have all the qualities of a boxer-- courage, pluck and endurance.

The year 1943 will offer us the opportunities to re-establish ourselves. Remember the last two lines from Henley's "Invictus":

"I am the Master of my Fate,
I am the Captain of my Soul."

Our future and that of our children will be determined by the extent we take to heart those two simple lines. K.O.

"POSTOPIA" IS MAIN AGRICULTURAL ATTRACTION AT THE FESTIVAL

Featuring "Postopia," a miniature model of future Poston II, by the Agriculture Department will be among the main attractions of the display at the New Year's Festival.

The model, complete to the last detail, shows the future design of the blocks, recreation areas, school, churches, the Cottonwood Bowl, swimming pool, zoo, stadium, agriculture center and other buildings.

Individual models on an enlarged scale will be displayed of the block, swimming pool and the farm. The 80-acre farm, leased from the Indian Service is the project sponsored by the Agriculture Department to aid in the supplying of food-stuff for Poston Two.

Forty-one varieties of prize vegetables raised within the blocks and nursery flats will also be displayed.

An unique cacti garden composed of varied species has been arranged in front of the Ag building in Barrack 2. Highlighting the garden is the 12-foot high, enormous cactus weighing 600 pounds. It was obtained by the landscape and nursery division on a recent field trip.

UNIT II EXPRESS OFFICE RENDERS OUTSTANDING SERVICE TO RESIDENTS

One of the outstanding service bureaus in Poston II is that of the Express office. According to statistics submitted, it was revealed that they had delivered a total of 1,051 packages during the period of Oct. 15-December 30.

The total number of parties served by the office was 759 during that period with the gross weight of the thousand-odd packages being approximately 31 tons.

The sum of \$1031.14 was collected (C.O.D., etc.) during the two and one-half month the office has been in operation.

F. K. Matsuura of 221 is the express master of the Unit II office. He is assisted by a staff of eight in fulfilling the various duties of receiving, delivery, collecting and book-keeping.
