APPROXIMATELY 2278 WORK CARDS
HAVE BEEN CLEARED TO POSTONITES;
335 APPLY AT OFFICE DAILY

Approximately 2278 work cards have been issued to date under the supervision of Miss Kathryn Mohn, Employment Director. An average of 335 applicants daily has been handled through this office.

Working with the Director is a staff of 21 persons. To the Commissary Dept. has been dispatched the largest number of workers, with the labor group second, and the clerical and selling division third.

A spokesman for the department points out that there is an unlimited opportunity for workers in Poston.
